
# **Snow Safety and Access During Winter Weather**

As winter weather arrives, please note that only the highlighted areas on the attached map will be cleared of snow as a priority. These include the two main entrances to the school and the path leading toward the parking lot (for staff) on the south side. Other areas, such as playgrounds, blacktop surfaces, and rear classroom doors, will not be cleared by Operations.

If snow conditions make it unsafe to use classroom doors for entry or dismissal, students will enter the school through the main entrance when the bell rings and walk to their classrooms. At the end of the day, students will be dismissed from the front of the school.

The Grounds Department will clear perimeter sidewalks and the parking lot as staffing allows, but please be aware that snow clearing beyond these priority areas may be limited.

Thank you for your understanding and cooperation in keeping everyone safe during winter conditions!

Respiratory Illness Season

The following information is provided for parents by Vancouver Coastal Health regarding things to consider if their child feels unwell.

Things to consider if your child feels unwell:

- 1. The wellbeing of your child. Without proper rest, a child may have a hard time fighting an illness or be at risk for other illnesses.
- 2. The ability of your child to actively take part and learn at school.
- 3. The school staff cannot care for a sick child and give them the support that they may need.
- 4. The protection of other children.

Please keep your child home if they:

- Have a fever. Are too sick to take part in all normal school activities.
- Have a suspected or known communicable disease (i.e. strep throat, chicken pox, measles).
- Is vomiting or has diarrhea. It is recommended that students be symptom free at least 24 hours before returning to school.

Keep your child home until they are able to participate fully in normal school activities or as told by a health care provider.

Please let the school know your child's symptoms, as per the school's call back procedures.

If the school finds it necessary to send your child home because of illness, please make sure you have arranged an emergency contact if you are not available. Inform your school of these arrangements.

If your child is too sick to go outside during break times, they/she/he is too sick to come to school.

## Kindergarten Registration for 2026-27



#### Kindergarten registration for children born in 2021 begins on November 1

All kindergarten applicants are required to complete an online application for their English catchment elementary school. This includes families who wish to apply for District Choice programs (Early French Immersion, Montessori, Indigenous Focus School, Early Mandarin Bilingual, Nootka Fine Arts) and/or make a cross-boundary application to attend a non-catchment school.

The priority registration period for kindergarten opens on **November 1** and closes on **January 31**. Students who submit an online application within this priority period will be accommodated <u>before</u> late applicants.

#### Applying for kindergarten is a 2-step process:

Step 1: Online Application (ApplyNow)

 Completion of an online application form (<a href="https://applynow.vsb.bc.ca/">https://applynow.vsb.bc.ca/</a>) for the school year 2026-27

#### Step 2: Verification of documentation

- After applying, you will receive instructions on how to schedule your in-person appointment.
- Bring supporting documentation during your scheduled appointment for verification.

#### Supporting documents needed:

- 1. Proof of residence in Vancouver
- Child's birth certificate
- 3. Immigration documentation (if applicable)
- 4. Immunization records
- 5. Court orders/documents (if applicable)

If you want to apply for a District Choice Program or cross boundary, you must

first apply to your English catchment elementary school. District Choice Programs and cross boundary applications will be accepted in early 2026. In the event there are more in-catchment applicants than available space\* at the school, the following process will be used to prioritize enrolment:

#### Kindergarten Applications Received Between November 1 and January 31

- In-catchment kindergarten applicants with siblings in attendance at the school (and who will be attending next year) will be placed first.
- 2. The names of all other in-catchment registrants will be entered into a random draw for the remaining kindergarten spaces.
- 3. Students who cannot be accommodated will be placed on a waitlist in the order in which their name was drawn.
- 4. In the event there are more in-catchment registrants than can be accommodated at their catchment school, students will be placed at another school as close to the catchment as possible until space becomes available.

#### Kindergarten Registrations Received AFTER January 31st

In-catchment kindergarten students who apply **after** January 31 will be accommodated if there is space. If there is no space, their names will be added to the bottom of the existing waitlist.

Note: Sibling priority does not apply for registrations received after January 31.

In the event there are more in-catchment registrants than can be accommodated at their catchment school, students will be placed at another school as close to the catchment as possible until space becomes available.
