




Photo Etiquette




The **last day of school** for students is Thursday, June 26th. School will be in session from 9:00 am until 2:58 pm.

Notice of Late Return

All students are expected to attend school on the first day of the new school year: Tuesday, September 2nd. If your child will be returning to school after this date, it is essential that a parent or legal guardian notifies the school in writing or by completing the Notice of Late Return Form by Thursday, June 26th, 2025. This ensures your child's space at the school is held. Please note: student spaces will not be held beyond September 30th. The Late Return Form is available at the school office.

Class Placement



In designing our new classes for September, our staff works closely together to create classroom communities that support every child's learning. We consider everything we've learned about your child to make the best possible placement.

This is a thoughtful and careful process that takes time and collaboration.

If your child is placed in a combined (split) class, please know this does not reflect their academic ability. Students in split classes are taught the full curriculum for their grade. Being in a split class does not mean your child is getting an advanced or less advanced program.

Our teachers are committed to placing students where they will thrive, and we are confident in the care and professionalism they bring to this process.

School Fees

As per MacCorkindale's past practice, fees for programs, workbooks and fieldtrips for students will be collected as needed. They are specific to your child(ren)'s class. First Day of School in September

The first day of instruction for the 2025-2026 School Year will be **Tuesday**, **September 2nd**. School Year 2025-26 Standardized School Fee Schedule

*Financial Hardship Policy

The Board of Education is committed to ensuring that no school-age student will be denied an opportunity to participate in a course, class or program because of an inability to pay fees. Parents and guardians unable to pay some or all school fees are invited to speak to their child's teacher, school counsellor, and/or the school Principal.

\$35.00 SCHOOL SUPPLY FEE

The Vancouver School Board offers the service of purchasing basic school supplies in bulk at wholesale prices and passing the cost savings on to families. The School Supply Fee for 2025-2026 is \$35.00 per student*. This optional fee covers basic consumable school supplies used for students' personal use such as paper, writing tools, glue sticks, erasers, exercise books and art supplies. Supplies are provided for the full year. Families can choose to purchase their own school supplies independently.

SUPPLEMENTAL FEES

Optional supplemental school fees can be charged for materials or goods that are surplus to what is necessary for the student to meet the expected curricular outcomes.

Agenda - School agendas/planners are a valuable tool for teaching children how to organize and plan for school. While students are not required to have an agenda/planner it is designed to assist students with the skills of organization and time management and is a very useful communication tool often used between teachers and families.	\$0 (PAC subsidized)
Workbooks - Students in some divisions will be using a mathematics practice and homework book. This material supplements the	
classroom math program. The workbook is available for purchase. Students are not obligated to purchase the workbook and may opt to use their copy as a reference textbook instead, meaning the workbook will be returned at the end of the school year for another student to use in	TBD
the future. Students opting to use the workbook as a textbook will be responsible for ensuring that it remains unmarked and in excellent condition to return the workbook at the end of the year and receive reimbursement.	\$15

VSB Educational Assistant Diploma Program

Are you looking for a rewarding job working in a school setting supporting children and youth with special needs? There is an ongoing need for qualified Educational Assistants in B.C. schools.

Our VSB EA Diploma Program offers:

- Relevant instruction in 14 critical courses provided by professionals active in their fields, over 400 hours of instruction.
- Pertinent workshops
- Certificates in CPI (Nonviolent Crisis Intervention) POPARD, First Aid, EASE, and Seizure Management
- 2-four week-practicums in VSB schools; over 250 hours of practical learning
- Mentoring throughout the 6-month program

Prerequisites include:

- Sufficient vision and hearing to perform job-related duties.
- Physically capable to lift 35 pounds (about 16 kg); transfer students from wheelchair to toilet, chair, recreational equipment or change table; keep up with active students throughout the school day.
- Minimum: Grade 12 Graduation and transcripts indicating academic capability to support students from kindergarten to Grade 12.
- Preference: 70% minimum in English 12 or equivalent.
- Preference: Experience working or volunteering with children/youth with diversities, especially in an educational setting.
