#### **Concern at School?**

Please remember that your child's teacher is your first point of contact. If parents have any concerns or questions regarding practices or activities occurring in their child's classroom, please discuss these concerns directly with the classroom teacher. Please contact the school via telephone, email or by putting a note in your child's agenda requesting an appointment. Most concerns are resolved at this point of contact.

After having spoken to the classroom teacher, if the issue is unresolved, an appointment with the Principal is the second step. Again, please contact the office to book an appointment in order to speak about matters privately.

If you have a concern about a child other than your own, please reach out to school staff. Only VSB STAFF are allowed to speak to that child. You may only speak to your own child.

Our school offers various programs to teach children diverse strategies for conflict resolution. We request that you allow our staff to guide and support your child in these matters.

#### School Feesand Student Forms

Please remember to pay your school fees as soon as you possibly can. The Vancouver School Board will not deny a child access to the school supplies required for his or her educational program because of financial hardship. Nor will any child be excluded from activities where a fee is charged. If at any time there is a financial challenge, please contact the school principal. All requests will be treated confidentially. Forms have been sent home with each student to be reviewed by a parent/guardian, signed and returned to the classroom teacher. Please ensure that the information on the forms are accurate, especially phone numbers.

## **Rainy Day Clothing**

The weather is becoming increasingly cold and wet. It is important that students are dressed appropriately for outside play. If their clothes become wet and cold, it is very difficult for them to focus on learning throughout the day. Please ensure that your child is dressed for outside play. Consider sending extra clothes for your child as a change.



### **Parent Sign-out**

#### Student Sign Out Procedure

- Students leaving school grounds during the school day MUST be picked up by an adult. When you pick up your child during the school day, please ensure that you sign them out at the school office. If you do not sign out your child or notify the classroom teacher, they/she/he will be unaccounted for, and the school will identify your child as a 'missing' student and will commence a search of school grounds. If the school staff do not locate the child, and are unable to reach a parent promptly, the school will call the Vancouver Police Department. Clear communication is essential for ensuring the safety of your child and to prevent unnecessary searches. Thank you for helping us keep your child(ren) safe!

inform the office and sign out your child.

### **Kindergarten Registration for 2024-2025**

Is your child 4 years old now and will turn 5 by December 31, 2024? Was your child born in 2019?

If so, it is almost time to register for kindergarten.

 Priority enrolment to register your child with the Vancouver School District will be online starting November 1, 2023 through to January 31, 2024

There is a two-step registration process to enroll your child in kindergarten.

- First, register your child(ren) online,
- Second, make an appointment with your catchment school to verify your information in person.

Halloween offers the opportunity to discuss costume choices with your child(ren). It is important not to inadvertently mimic culture by culturally appropriating racial or ethnic groups.



On October 31, we look forward to some Halloween fun at MacCorkindale! Here are a few Halloween reminders:

- Costumes are optional. Many students enjoy and look forward to seeing other kids (and staff) in costume. Students are welcome to come to school in costume if they wish to do so on Tuesday, October 31st.
- Costumes that promote any kind of discrimination or are culturally insensitive are of course not appropriate (following our Code of Conduct)
- Please keep in mind, weapons are not allowed at school at any time, even if they form part of a costume. Please leave any items that look like guns/swords/knives/axes, etc. at home so that they can be part of your child's costume for the evening's festivities.
- Fragile parts of costumes should also be left at home so that they are intact and ready for Halloween night's festivities.
- If your costume is very scary, please be mindful of our youngest students at MacCorkindale (some are 4 years old). Remember that all break times are outside in the fresh air- if parts of the costume are fragile or not weather resistant, please plan ahead to be ready to go outside for the breaks. Some students may choose to remove their costume and leave it in their classroom before they head outside in their rain gear.

#### Stay Safe! (Home Alone)- Nov. 18

Do you or your parents want to feel confident knowing you are responsible on your own and have the skills to deal safely with an emergency situation? Included: First Aid. Active role-play! Interactive and fun! Course Content: Canadian Red Cross Principals, My Family and Me, My Time: Scheduled and Leisure Activities, Expecting The Unexpected, Healthy Choices, First Aid (Handwashing, Check, Call, Care, Complete Choking - Alone, Anaphylaxis and Use of Epipen Auto-Injector, Life- Threatening External Bleeding)

#### Red Cross Babysitting Course- Oct. 14, 2023

This course offers basic first aid and caregiving skills for youth 11-15 years old. Participants learn how to provide care to children in a variety of age groups, and how to prevent and respond to emergencies. The course also offers youth the skills to promote themselves as babysitters to prospective families.

Each participant will need to bring a nut free lunch and snack, and a doll or teddy bear for practice!
