## Supervision

We also ask that parents/guardians pick up their child(ren) as close to 3pm as possible at the end of the day, as after school supervision ends at 3:20pm.

# Everyday is an OUTSIDE Day!



A friendly reminder that <u>every day</u> is an outside day; so please ensure your child(ren) comes to school dressed for the weather, whether it's rain or shine. We also recommend sending an extra change of clothes in case your child needs to change during the day. Thank you for helping to keep our students comfortable and ready for outdoor activities!

# Safe Arrival

Student safety is of paramount importance. Ensuring student safety is a shared responsibility. In order to assist the school, we ask parents to notify us of student absences. If your child will be late or absent, please phone the school to report this absence as early as possible. Parents can call the office number at 604-713-4775, you may call any time 24 hours a day. Messages are checked in the morning. If you are coming in late, please report to the office to sign-in to receive a late slip before sending your child(ren) to class.



### **Health Protocols**



Wearing masks continues to be a personal choice in the school. Please ensure to <u>keep your child home if they are ill</u>. We will be sending any students who are ill home without exception.

# Forgotten Items

We are having an increased number of students who have left lunches and other items at home. We will either call your child to the office or deliver it close to lunch time.



### 2024-25 General School Fees & Other Fees



A friendly reminder to complete payment of this year's school fees. The School Supply Fee for 2024-2025 remains at \$35.00 per student. This fee covers basic consumable school supplies used for students' personal use such as paper, writing tools, glue sticks, erasers, exercise books and art supplies. Teachers may ask for specific items for their division/class.

# Concern at School?

Your child's teacher is your first point of contact. If parents have any questions or concerns regarding activities occurring in their child(ren)'s classroom, please discuss these concerns directly with the classroom teacher. Please contact the school via telephone, email or by putting a note in your child(ren)'s agenda requesting an appointment. Most concerns are resolved at this point of contact.

After having spoken to the classroom teacher, if the issue is unresolved, an appointment with the Principal is the second step. Again, please contact the office to book an appointment in order to speak about matters privately.

If you have a concern about a child other than your own, please reach out to school staff. Only VSB STAFF are allowed to speak to that child. You may only speak to your own child.

Our school offers various programs to teach children diverse strategies for conflict resolution. We request that you allow our staff to guide and support your child in these matters.



## **Terry Fox Run**

We were fortunate to have the weather cooperate for the  $44^{\text{th}}$  anniversary of the Terry Fox Run. 


Dear MacCorkindale Community,

# 2024 District Cross Country Meet Information

We are excited to share important details about the upcoming 2024 District Cross-Country Meet. The event is set for Tuesday, October 22, 2024, from 1:00 - 3:00 pm at Trout Lake Park (19th Avenue & Victoria Drive). The following information is provided to help ensure the day is a memorable, safe and positive experience for everyone.

This year, there will be a new format for primary students in the cross country meets. All primary students will now run with their peers in the same grade, without differentiating their gender. They will be racing based on their grade and heat according to school name\*. This change supports our Education Plan and our commitment to fostering an inclusive environment for all students. Additionally, every student participating in these races will receive a participation ribbon to celebrate their effort and enthusiasm.

The first race (Grade 7 boys) will start at 1:00 pm. Subsequent races will begin every 8 minutes. Parents should err on the side of caution if they are trying to estimate what time their child is running. Grade 7 boys should be in the marshalling area by 12:50 pm.

#### **Event Venue and Parking:**

- We are prepared to hold the event regardless of weather conditions. Any facility closures will be determined by the Parks Board and communicated promptly. Changes to the event will be communicated via school coaches and administrators, as well as the Elementary Athletics Team.
- Parking is available off 19th Avenue. Those parking illegally or blocking driveways will be towed. Please carpool, take public transit, cycle or walk to the site, if possible. Please note that we will **not** have access to the Trout Lake Community Centre parking lot this year.

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**Safety and Event Regulations:** To ensure the safety and success of all participants and spectators, please adhere to the following rules:

- **Tent Placement:** For safety reasons, we request that no tents be set up near the marshaling area or the start and finish lines. These areas tend to be congested, and overcrowding can cause safety concerns.
- Course Access: Only race participants will be permitted in the marshaling area and on the course. Parents are requested not to gather near the starting and finishing lines and must wait outside the roped areas to collect, congratulate, or take photos of their runners. Please stay within designated course boundaries to prevent accidents.
- Participation Requirement: To ensure fitness and safety, all participating students should have competed in a mini-meet before running in the District Meet.
- No Pacing or Running Alongside: Parents and coaches are prohibited from pacing, running, or biking alongside runners at any point during the race.
- Electronic Devices: With the exception of watches, participants are not allowed to wear any electronic devices, including GoPros.
- Appropriate Dressing: Athletes should dress appropriately while waiting for their race. This may include gloves, rain suits, extra socks, hats, umbrellas, and blankets. Please ensure that athletes are in proper gym attire for their race, with warm clothing for after the event. Starters may withdraw students inappropriately dressed (e.g., jeans or boots).
- Spectator Areas: All spectators must watch the races from outside the course boundaries. Certain areas will be roped off to ensure the safety of the runners and officials.

#### **Additional Information:**

- Please leave dogs at home if possible. If this is not possible, ALL pets must be under control and leashed and away from any course boundaries, including the marshalling area and the start and finish lines.
- Washroom facilities are available in the park on the south side of the lake. Additional portable toilets will also be on site near the caretaker's house.
- Please bring your own garbage bags. Leave your area clean at the end of the meet. Failure to do so
  may result in additional fees from the Park Board.
- All spectators are reminded to be respectful of all other spectators and participants. We welcome
  all students across the finish line with enthusiasm.

We appreciate your cooperation and understanding as we work together to create a safe and enjoyable environment for young VSB athletes. We look forward to seeing you at Trout Lake Park on October 22<sup>nd</sup> cheering on the athletes as they give their best on the cross-country course. Thank you for being a part of this exciting event.
