1. Welcome, Land Acknowledgment and Call to Order – Ysaura Jaliri

- 2. Approval of Agenda
 - Agenda accepted by consensus.

3. VLN Principal Information – Jim Rutley

- Jim Rutley gave a welcome and provided an overview of VLN:
 - VLN includes elementary and secondary courses
 - 3000 students from ages 4 to 84 years old
 - students take online courses for a wide range of reasons
 - K-9 courses run from Sept to June while Gr 10-12 courses run year-round; most courses require two onsite exams
- 40+ teachers (6 core secondary teachers, 3 elementary teachers, 3 counsellors and 30+ secondary teachers who also teach and are based at other VSB Secondary Schools) and additional teachers help out over the summer.

- VLN is in process of seeking approval to be a provincial online school; students no longer required to be Vancouver resident
- VLN implemented a new instance of their Learn Management System called Brightspace
- 4. VP Information Dr Kerry Handscomb
 - We have four different funding collection windows. We offer the provincial numeracy and literacy assessments four times throughout the school year. Though we provide formal report cards for secondary students in November, February, April, and June, students receive final report cards throughout the year once they have completed a course. In Elementary, we host the FSA (Foundational Skills Assessment). There are two parent-teacher-student conferences in November and April with formal reports created and distributed at the end of January and June.
 - VLN works to bring the best learning and engagement opportunities possible for VLN students, aiming to be similar to those at a regular school.
 - Student Voice an opportunity for VLN students to work together on a year long project of their choosing. Previous projects include a stall on Main Street for Car Free Day, creating a student Code of Conduct, and indigenous academic content and artwork. - a) VLN Mascot Dr Kerry Handscomb
 - Student Voice students worked together to develop a mascot concept, and acquired input from the student body via a survey (several hundred responses). The final choice was an Indigenous themed mascot and Student Voice students decided to engage a professional artist to make good on the student's choice.

b) PAC Scholarships

- There are scholarship funds available to support graduating VLN students; revenue is derived from gaming grants. Availability is reviewed and decided on annual basis by PAC. Counsellors share directly other scholarship information with their students. PAC will work with VLN to provide scholarship information on VLN website.
