### ELEMENTARY AND SECONDARY STUDENT REGISTRATION



#### Children start Kindergarten at 5 years old

Families can register their child(ren) for Kindergarten if the student will reach the age of five years on or before December 31 of the calendar year.

#### Students enter Grade 8 at 13 years old

Students usually enter Secondary school in September of the school year in which they are 13 years of age.


#### **VANCOUVER PUBLIC SCHOOL**

#### **SCHOOL REGULAR SESSION**

#### September to June

#### Who should register at DRPC?

- ALL students (K-12) NOT BORN in Canada.
- ALL students (1-12) BORN in Canada but who DO NOT speak English as their home language.
- Parent/legal guardian is neither Canadian nor Permanent Resident.

## Who should register directly at neighbourhood schools?

- ALL students (K-12) BORN in Canada who speak English as their home language.
- ALL Kindergarten Students BORN in Canada, regardless of language spoken at home.

### WHAT DOES THE PARENT NEED TO BRING TO REGISTER?

Bring your child AND the following original documents and translation for document which are NOT in English or French:

#### 1. Proof of address in the City of Vancouver:

- A current property tax statement or purchased agreement with subject removal and deposit receipt.
- A current long term rental/lease agreement. If NOT CURRENT, please bring additional current bills.

Note: Catchment school may ask for more documentation (e.g. recent utility or cable bill).

- Child's Birth Certificate [in English and ideally showing parent's names]
- 3. Proof of Status in Canada: [both parents and child]
- Confirmation of Permanent Residence Document and Passport(s) or Permanent Residence Card(s) if available.
- Work Permit and Passport(s)--with parent's [min. one year] current employment letter.
- Study Permit and Passport(s)--with parent's program admission letter and payment receipt.
- Refugee Claimant Document.
- Diplomatic Card or Passport(s).
- Canadian Passport or Citizenship Certificate.
- Aboriginal Status Identification Card.
- Any other relevant immigration document.

Note: Some schools may request additional identification as proof of residency.

- 4. School Report Cards (in English or French)
- Elementary Most recent year of report card.
- Secondary All report cards from Grade 7 (age 13 to present).
- Any Individual Education Plan [IEP], Psycho-Education Reports, or Medical Report.
- 5. Child's Immunization Records (No need to

translate). If available, please bring any other important health information.

6. Guardianship's Relevant Documentation (In

English or French) A Court Order (Divorce/ Separation) or a Parent Consent Letter from the second parent who currently does not reside with the student.
