Dear L'École Bilingue families,

Did you know that L'Ecole Bilingue has an RBLM room and a Sensory room to support students' Social Emotional Learning? Our School Learning Plan (school goal) continues to focus on implementing strategies and tools to support our students with self-regulation and executive functioning challenges and stretches.

One strategy used to support this goal is the RBLM (Ready Bodies Learning Minds) program, which we are very pleased to offer at L'Ecole Bilingue. RBLM supports sensory integration and motor control which in return helps students with their academic successes. The goal of the RBLM program is "Helping the children develop skills for learning readiness and mastery of the environment".

In our RBLM room, students rotate through a series of activities that address in particular: Reflexes, Vestibular, Proprioceptive, Tactile, Visual, and Auditory systems.

There are also activities for Eye-Hand-Foot coordination, Locomotor, Balance, Motor Control, Ball Work and Handwriting. All systems work together, and one activity will feed multiple systems.

We are most fortunate to have our dedicated Support Workers trained in RBLM, so that they may work with students in the RBLM room. Also currently, we have two teachers trained and many more who will be trained by district staff in the new year, so that more students may benefit.



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Our RBLM room would not be possible without the financial support from the PAC. So, a big heartfelt THANK YOU for helping

L'Ecole Bilingue achieve our goal of having a fully functional RBLM room. We are so grateful, and our students truly benefit thanks to you!

- register your child at their neighbourhood catchment school AND
- apply online to the Kindergarten District Choice Program between January 8 and February 2 indicating the child is the sibling of a current student in the French Immersion program
