SAFETY DRILLS AND REQUESTS

On Thursday, October 26th, we took advantage of the sunny weather, and held our first earthquake drill of the year. Schools are required to hold six fire drills, two earthquake drills and two lock down drills a year. During fire and earthquake drills, classes exit the building and line up on the gravel field by division.

I'm happy to report that our students did a fantastic job, following their teacher's directions, as they safely and calmly exited the building during this earthquake drill, as well as at our first fire drill which took place on October 3rd. Teachers always prepare students in advance of drills, to ensure that they understand the safety procedures.

As we work together to ensure student safety, if at any time you feel that improvements or additions could be made to the surrounding streets, such as by adding a traffic calming circle at an intersection, please submit a request to the city through this link Vancouver Traffic Calming Request for the particular area of concern, where you feel that student safety has been compromised. Change is only possible with many voices.
