
## **Newsletter #9**

#### **BASKETBALL SEASON PREPARATION**

It is already time to prepare for the basketball season!

There will be an information meeting on **Monday November 20**<sup>th</sup> at 12:10 in the gym. Registration for students from grade 5 to 7 will open at the meeting and close on **Thursday November 23**<sup>rd</sup>. This closing date is necessary as the VSB expects our FINAL team count for scheduling. If your child wishes to join a team, please check your child's availability based on the game schedule below and remind them to register and to return their permission form to the office before the above deadline.

It is also important for your child to understand that the LEC team count, planning, organization, and VSB registration are based on the number of registered players. Therefore, we ask students not to withdraw their names after the closing deadline.

Games will begin mid-January and be between 3:00 and 4:45 pm. Teams will play four to six weeks, depending on how they fare.

- Junior Boys (gr. 5 & 6) games will be on Mondays
- Junior Girls (gr. 5 & 6) games will be on Tuesdays
- Senior Boys (gr. 7) games will be on Wednesdays
- Senior Girls (gr. 7) games will be on Thursdays

Practices will begin in January (or in some cases in December) and will be held before school (8:00 am) and/or at lunch with times to be announced and posted at the gym entrance.

The number of teams we can sponsor also depends on how many adults are available. As many coaches and trainers will be needed, we are inviting parents to share their basketball expertise. Further, if you are a VSB employee, you can offer to be a chaperone (necessary for a team to be registered). This does not entail any coaching duties or knowledge of the game but only to be at the games and to sit on the bench with the team.
