Extreme Weather Policy

All students are asked to come to school dressed and prepared for the weather. Unless there are extreme conditions, all students will be asked to go outside for the recess and lunch break.

In the event of extreme conditions (for example; extremely heavy rain, wind and/or lightning), the principal and/or acting principal will announce an 'Inside Day' prior to the break.

There are four locations for an "Inside Day."

- a) The Gym
- b) The Library
- c) The Stage
- d) The Undercover Area



Other than in exceptional circumstances, students will still be allowed to go outside as long as they are dressed appropriately and supervision will be provided. With the exception of the gym, all students going to the inside areas must bring a quiet activity (for example: cards, a board game, puzzle, drawing, etc.) which can be obtained from the classroom teacher before leaving for the break. If a student does not bring a quiet activity they will be asked to go outside. In the interest of fairness, each grade level will rotate through each area each month. The schedule is as follows:
