# **COVID 19 – MESSAGE SHARED BY THE BOARD**



The Vancouver School District and Jamieson Elementary continue to follow the guidance of the Ministry of Education and Child Care, the BC Centre for Disease Control and Vancouver Coastal Health in putting in place measures to help prevent the spread of COVID-19. The BC Centre for Disease Control updated <u>guidance</u> for the K-12 sector indicates that, "Transmission within K-12 schools settings accounts for a minority of COVID-19 cases even amongst students and staff."

Measures that will continue to be in place for the coming school year include reminders to all staff, students and their families to monitor their

health daily and to stay home if they are ill. Information about COVID-19 symptoms can be found on the <u>BCCDC website</u>. Students who become ill during the school day will be asked to wear a mask and wait in a supervised area, away from other students, until they can be picked up by a parent or guardian.

Staff will continue to remind students of the importance of regular hand washing/hand sanitizing and of coughing/sneezing into their elbow or a tissue. We will continue to ensure school sinks are well stocked with soap and that hand sanitizer is available. Staff will also continue to remind students to be respectful of others' personal space while going through daily school activities.

Wearing a mask, other than what is recommended by public health, is an important personal health choice for students and families. Some staff and students will choose to wear a mask throughout the day or for certain activities. Others will choose not to wear a mask. Individual decisions around mask wearing will be supported and respected at Jamieson Elementary.

Clean air and proper ventilation is an important part of the prevention measures in all Vancouver schools. During the past months, District staff have undertaken the refurbishment and rehabilitation of ventilation equipment in all schools and will continue to install new ventilation and heating equipment in portables. Air filters in schools have been upgraded and are replaced three times per year.

# **REPORTING STUDENT ABSENCES**



# **Reporting Student Absences:**

Student safety is of paramount importance at the Vancouver School District. Ensuring student safety is a shared responsibility. To assist schools, we ask parents to notify schools of student absences. If your child will be absent from school, please phone the school to report this absence as early as possible. Parents should call the school and leave a message on the dedicated answering service by calling 604-713-5367 Option 1. Messages will be picked up between 8:55 am and 9:15 am. School offices are busy places: consistently notifying the school in advance of your child's absence will significantly improve the efficiency and effectiveness of the Safe Arrival Morning Routine.

To Report Your Child's Absence -Call 604-713-5367 - Option 1 prior to 9 am on the first day of the absence.

### Student Sign Out Procedure

When you pick up your child during the school day, please ensure that you sign them out at the school office. If you do not sign out your child or notify the classroom teacher, they/she/he will be unaccounted for, and the school will identify your child as a 'missing' student and will commence a search of school grounds. If the school staff do not locate the child, and are unable to reach a parent promptly, the school will call the Vancouver Police Department.

Therefore, clear communication is essential for ensuring the safety of your child and to prevent unnecessary searches. Thank you for helping us keep your child(ren) safe!

#### **Extended Absences**

We encourage all students to attend school consistently, on time, every day. However, we understand that there will be times where an extended absence is unavoidable. In the case of an extended absence, please provide written notification to the school office. All extended absences in excess of 20 school days should be discussed with Mrs. Miladinovic. Enrolment cannot be guaranteed if an absence exceeds 20 consecutive school days.

### Early Pick Up

Please let your child(ren)'s classroom teacher know when your child will be picked up early. Please inform the office and sign out your child. The office staff will phone up to the classroom to let the teacher know to send your child to the office once you have arrived.

# STUDENTS WITH MEDICAL CONDITIONS



It is the responsibility of the parent/guardian to inform/update the school each year if your child has a medically diagnosed, life-threatening health condition. If your child requires medication please bring it to the Office as soon as possible. In addition, please complete and update the emergency contact/medical information forms which will be sent home later in September.

# **TRAFFIC**



The City of Vancouver has informed us that there will be updates to the sewers and transportation improvements along W 49th Avenue. The construction is scheduled to start on Sept 6th and the anticipated completion is Summer 2023. Unfortunately, this will impact pick up and drop off, as they have indicated that they will have to make some traffic adjustments such as restrictions on turning movements at the intersection of Tisdall and W 49th Avenue. Please see the maps provided by the City. We are encouraging families to familiarize yourself with the restrictions in order to allow more time for drop off and pick-up. There is absolutely

no U-turning on any streets surrounding the school. The neighbourhood streets are quite narrow and during busy times, this adds to the congestion and confusion. Please help us keep our students safe and follow all traffic rules and posted parking regulations. We encourage everybody to walk or bike to school. It is a great way to start and end the day!

The two traffic maps (attached) will be used intermittently throughout the construction period. Below are the schedules (which are subject to change) for when these stages will be in place. We will provide updates when needed.

- Stage 1 will be in place for 2-3 days starting Wednesday, Sept 7th and Stage 2 will be in place the week of September 12th, again for 2-3 days.
- Both will be implemented for longer periods during the mainline construction as follows:
  - i. Stage 2 will be in place in October for about 2 weeks and again in April for about 1 week
  - ii. Stage 1 will be in place in January for about a week and again in April for about 1 week

It has become an opportunity to honour and remember all impacted by the residential school system and to come together in the spirit of reconciliation. Orange Jamieson shirts will be available for purchase for \$15 at the office beginning September 12<sup>th</sup>. Limited sizes and quantities available on a first come first serve basis.
