If your child would like to participate, please join us at a PAC meeting. Another name will be entered in the draw.






### JEANS UP WEEK! MAY 6-10


A consent form will be sent home to families at the beginning of June before the workshops take place.







#### BOOK EXCHANGE

## TRAFFIC SAFETY

We continue to work together to keep the community safe. A few things to keep in mind in and around Norquay:

- Drop off/pick up: If you are leaving your car for any reason during pick up and drop off, please park in a space designated for general parking (30min Green P, 2 hour green P, unrestricted). Pick up and drop off zones (red P, 3min Green P) are designed to accommodate several cars trying to get to the same location at the same time, which only works if everyone keeps the flow of vehicles moving.
- Lane North of Norquay: There is very clear no stopping signage posted in the lane to the north of the school. (<u>Street and Traffic Bylaw 2849 section 17.6(a)</u>). Do not park or stop in any way that obstructs travel through a lane or along a street (<u>Street and Traffic Bylaw 2849 section 19.1(d</u>)). We do receive photos of families not following these rules, so traffic enforcement patrols regularly.
