Thank you to our incredible parent volunteers who made the Spring Fair on Friday such a joyful and memorable event. The students had a fantastic time, the rain held off, and the day was filled with warmth, community spirit, and fun. Your time and energy made it all possible!

This year, our school learning plan focused on two key goals: Reconciliation and Literacy. In support of Call to Action 83, we partnered with the Power in YOUth leadership group to showcase a stunning blanket created by acclaimed Musqueam weaver Debra Sparrow. The Power in YOUth group led meaningful learning around the significance of the blanket and Debra Sparrow's vision to "blanket the city." All 655 students participated in this project, and the completed blanket is now proudly displayed at the entrance of our library—a lasting symbol of Indigenous joy, creativity, and our shared commitment to reconciliation.

Our school-wide literacy inquiry centered on building intentional connections among staff, students, and families, as we know strong adult connections are a key factor in student achievement and success. Through storytelling, student voice, and data collection, we learned that these efforts have led to school-wide improvements in literacy, which you'll see reflected in both report cards and our school learning plan.

As we close out the year, we also say goodbye to some cherished members of our community. Mr. Mulligan and Mrs. Kwan are retiring after remarkable careers. We wish them all the best as they begin a new chapter—free of alarm clocks, bells, and report cards! Congratulations to Mr. Loong and Ms. Robertson, who have completed their counselling degrees and will be joining the VSB counselling team. We also extend our heartfelt thanks and farewells to Ms. Rajbeer and Ms. Sarah (SSSAs), Ms. Boswell (Speech and Language Pathologist), Ms. Foster (SELC teacher), Ms. Smith and Ms. Bailey (Grade 7 job share), Ms. Natasha (supervision aide), and Ms. Hong (Reading Recovery teacher). 




WATCHING THE GARDEN GROW
