COMMUNICATING STUDENT LEARNING

Most Vancouver elementary public schools, along with schools throughout British Columbia, have moved from a model of 'reporting to parents' on a regular and pre-determined schedule to 'communicating student learning with parents' on an on-going basis throughout the school year. This year, parents will receive five communications from teachers within a school year:



- a written progress report at the end of January
- a written summative report at the end of June
- a minimum of three ongoing communications of student learning in various subject areas; these communications include Parent Conferences on October 23 and 24 and February 12 and 13

The written reports will include descriptive comments and a summary of student progress in relation to the learning standards from the BC Curriculum.

FALL WEATHER AND RAINY DAYS



With a change in seasons comes a change in weather. Students will be going outside for recess and lunch on most days, so please ensure your children are dressed appropriately for the colder, wetter weather. Also, don't forget to label your child's clothing. Our lost and found area is filling up, so please stop by to retrieve any lost items that belong to your child.

BEDTIME AND SCHOOL

Here are some quick tips for a good night's sleep:

- Have scheduled bedtimes and wake-up times, even on weekends.
- Make sure bedrooms are dark, cool, and quiet with a comfortable mattress and pillow.
- In the morning, open the curtains to let the light shine in!
- Regular physical activity during the day, to tire out the body.
- Turn off any computers, TVs, tablets and cellphones at least 30 min before bedtime. These devices
 produce bright lights and loud noises that keep your mind stimulated and awake.
- Avoid eating a large meal just before bedtime.
- Avoid drinks that have caffeine such as pop, energy drinks, tea or coffee at least 4 hours before bedtime.

REGISTRATION PROCESS FOR KINDERGARTEN



Kindergarten registration for children born in 2015 begins on November 1st.

All Kindergarten applicants are required to submit an application to their English catchment elementary school. This includes families who wish to apply for choice programs (French Immersion, Montessori, etc.) and/or a cross boundary placement.

The priority registration period for Kindergarten opens on Friday, November 1st and closes at 4 pm on Friday, January 31st. Students who submit an application within this priority period will be accommodated <u>before</u> late applicants.

Applying for Kindergarten is a 2-Step process:

Step 1: Completion of an online application form.

<u>Step 2:</u> Bringing supporting documentation, along with your child, to your neighbourhood English catchment school.

Supporting Documents Needed:

- 1. Proof of residence in Vancouver
- 2. Child's birth certificate
- 3. Immigration documentation (if applicable)
- 4. Immunization records
- 5. Court Orders/Documents (if applicable)

If you want to apply for a Choice program or cross-boundary, you must <u>first apply to your English catchment elementary school</u>. Applications for Choice programs and cross boundary placements will begin to be accepted in early 2020.





In the event there are more in-catchment applicants than available space* at the school, the following process will be used to prioritize enrolment:

Kindergarten Applications Received Between November 1st and January 31st

- 1. In-catchment Kindergarten applicants with siblings in attendance at the school (and who will be attending next year) will be placed first.
- 2. The names of all other in-catchment registrants will be entered into a random draw for the remaining Kindergarten spaces.
- 3. Students who cannot be accommodated will be placed on a waitlist in the order in which their name was drawn.
- 4. Between January 31st and the second Friday in June students on the ordered waitlist will be accommodated as space becomes available.

Kindergarten Registrations Received AFTER January 31st

In-catchment Kindergarten students who apply after January 31st will be accommodated if there is space. If there is no space their names will be added to the bottom of the existing waitlist.

Note: There will be no priority given to registrants with siblings if they register after January 31st. For more information on kindergarten registration visit: http://www.vsb.bc.ca/kindergarten

Applying for Mini School and Test Registration

VSB's Mini School programs provide enrichment opportunities for highly motivated students who are Vancouver residents and consistently achieve B averages or higher. Students must apply to each program separately by picking up an application package at the school where the program is offered.

Each year over 1,400 students apply for approximately 600 grade 8 spaces in the Mini School programs. Acceptance is based on test marks, grade 6 and/or 7 report cards, applications and interviews.

Please remember that all VSB secondary schools have a variety of challenging and exciting programs and courses, and that many students who take the regular programs graduate, receive scholarships and attend the university of their choice. Many schools have also developed their own school-based enrichment program for a wide variety of interests and abilities.


