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KINDERGARTEN REGISTRATION PROCEDURES FOR 2022-2023



Applications for Kindergarten for the 2022-2023 year will begin on November 1st. Catchment students applying for registration between November 1st, through the last weekday in January (January 31st) will be given first consideration over those who apply later. Montessori Kindergarten will be determined by a District run lottery. If you have a child born in 2017 or know someone that will have a child attending Kindergarten in September 2022, please register them during the above time frame in order to help guarantee your child's placement in their home school.

SUPERVISION OF STUDENTS
