Reference to GOAL 2: The Vancouver School Board will increase equity by:

Education Plan OBJECTIVE: Improving stewardship of the district's resources by focusing on

effectiveness, efficiency, and sustainability.

INTRODUCTION

The Board of Education is responsible, through the Superintendent of Schools, for overseeing the educational and operational activities of the District and for all statutory requirements of provincial legislation to implement educational standards and policies. The approval of the Annual Budget is one of those responsibilities under the *School Act*, specifically school districts must annually approve, by bylaw, a balanced budget for the next fiscal year and submit it to the Ministry of Education by June 30 of the current fiscal year. In addition, under Section 9.1 of Board Policy 2, the Board must approve the budget process and timelines at the outset of the budget process.

This budget development process and timeline document is presented for the committee's consideration and recommendation to the Board of Education for approval.

BACKGROUND

The District's budget is prepared in accordance with the following Provincial legislation and Treasury Board regulations that establish government's framework for financial reporting:

- 1. Section 23.1 of the Budget Transparency and Accountability Act
- 2. Regulations 257/2010 and 198/2011 issued by the Province of BC Treasury Board

As required by the standards established by the Public Sector Accounting Board ("PSAB") for budgeting and financial reporting, the District reports revenues and expenses under three separate funds: the operating fund, the special purpose fund, and the capital fund. Under the PSAB standards the District is required to prepare a budget incorporating the format described in the attached Appendix A. The summary budget document (Statement 2 – Revenue and Expense) contains the required budget bylaw that the Board of Education must approve by June 30, 2023 as per the *School Act*. Statement 2 is the consolidation of the operating, special purpose, and capital funds of the District. A brief description of these funds follows:





OPERATING FUND: The operating fund includes Ministry grants and other revenues used to fund instructional programs, school and district administration, facilities operations, maintenance, and transportation.

SPECIAL PURPOSE FUND: The special purpose fund includes separate, identifiable funds designed for a specific use or program. These funds are received from the Ministry of Education and other sources with restrictions on how they may be spent.

CAPITAL FUND: The capital fund includes a combination of Ministry capital grants and locally generated funds. These funds are used for facility operations including construction, seismic upgrades, enhancement, and maintenance of buildings, fields and infrastructure.

While the District is required to budget for all three funds, this planning document is focused on Schedule 2 of the PSAB format (Operating Revenue and Expense), which encompasses the District's operating activities. Separate budgets will be prepared for the Special Purpose Fund and the Capital Fund and will be presented at future meetings of the Committee.

DIRECTION FOR OPERATING FUND BUDGET DEVELOPMENT

Guiding Direction for Budget Development

The development of the District's budget for 2023-2024 will be guided by two significant directions:

- Education Plan
- Structural Deficit Reduction Motion

Education Plan

The Education Plan provides the foundational direction for budget development in Goal 2 where "increasing equity" is addressed as "Improving stewardship of the district's resources by focusing on effectiveness, efficiency, and sustainability." The foundational Education Plan Equity Statement refers to creating an equitable learning environment where every child can experience a deep sense of belonging and is free to pursue pathways of learning in ways that are authentic to themselves. This relates to budget development in the second objective:

 prioritizing student needs by making informed decisions and engaging in open communication with rightsholders and stakeholders

The Education Plan and the included Equity Statement were developed halfway through the last school year, but the directions mentioned above have been reflected in previous budget development processes in the following guiding priorities:

 Maintaining a focus on student achievement, recognizing the personalized learning needs of students





- Reflecting on responsible stewardship in implementing the objectives of the District's educational, financial, and facilities-related plans
- Respecting the District's decision-making culture, encouraging creativity and innovation in meeting the learning needs of specific communities
- Be sustainable over the longer term while providing the flexibility to address changing shortterm needs
- Focusing on equity for all students of the District
- Reflecting the specific needs of vulnerable students; and,
- Including engagement with the District's educational leaders and stakeholder groups as well as the opportunities for broader community input.

Structural Deficit Reduction Motion

At the October 24, 2022 meeting of the Board of Education the following motion was adopted unanimously:

That the Vancouver Board of Education direct staff to present strategies to address the structural deficit for trustees' consideration as part of the annual budget process.

The rationale provided for the motion was that structural deficit information had been provided in previous annual budget development processes, that the District ended the 2021-2022 fiscal year with a \$12.3 million deficit in the operating fund and that the District's accumulated operating surplus balance is insufficient to address future operating fund deficits. This last rationale is significant as one of the major indications of a structural deficit is the continued use of prior years' surpluses to balance the budget.

Structural Deficit

A structural deficit occurs when an organization's ongoing expenditures are continually greater than revenue received, including government funding and other sources of revenue. If revenue does not cover expenses over time, the structural deficit will have a cumulative effect. The reality is that the cost structure in the budget is too high. This has become particularly evident during the declining student enrolment trend the District is experiencing which has been exacerbated by reduced enrolment in the International Student Program, a program that provides significant non-Ministry funding. In addition, the higher cost associated with maintaining old buildings and operating more sites than required to meet the current educational needs of students contribute to the structural deficit.

Factors contributing to the District's structural deficit include:

- the impact of enrolment declines over time
- creation of programs that do not have a funding source or that rely on surplus funds
- provision of services that do not have funding source
- collective agreement wage lifts not fully funded over time
- maintaining a higher than required level of non-enrolling teacher staffing
- excluded wage lifts not funded over time





- decrease in enrolment in the International Student Program
- higher costs associated with maintaining old buildings
- lack of funding to offset inflationary factors
- operating more sites than are required to meet the current and projected student enrolment

To address the structural deficit, the District must make structural changes. This will include long-term changes, rethinking and restructuring operations and related costs. This direction would align with Goal 2 of the Education Plan 2026 where "increasing equity" is addressed as "Improving stewardship of the district's resources by focusing on effectiveness, efficiency, and sustainability."

There are many strategies that the Board could consider in addressing the structural deficit in the District's budget. To implement deficit reducing strategies, the Board and stakeholders must recognize that financial resources are limited and to support students in schools they must be allocated judicially and as equitably as possible. Reflecting on the objective in Goal 2 of the Education Plan, the allocation of these limited resources must address operational efficiencies and be sustainable.

Balanced Budget Concept & Connection to Education Plan

The District's budget development process involves engagement with all stakeholder groups with the goal of producing a balanced budget, as required by the *School Act*. To accomplish this, there should be an understanding of the connection between the goals and objectives in the Education Plan 2026 and the allocation of resources in the budget. Education Plan will focus on the District's core goals to support student achievement and well-being for the next five years. This plan will guide the budget development process in planning spending priorities to ensure the goals and objectives are met. Along with the Education Plan, the District's Framework for Enhancing Student Learning (Framework) will also play a key role in developing spending plans to ensure the focus is on enhancing student learning and success.

Connected to the Framework is the development of multi-year financial plans as required in the Administrative Procedure 503 – Financial Planning and Reporting. District staff have commenced internal discussions with the Educational Services, Learning Services and Operations departments to develop multi-year plans. These will be consulted on in accordance with the Administrative Procedure, including with the Indigenous Education Council. The first year of the multi-year plans will become the preliminary annual budget for 2023-2024.

In balancing the budget, staff will also consider the Board Motion from the October 24, 2022 meeting:

That the Vancouver Board of Education direct staff to present strategies to address the structural deficit for trustees' consideration as part of the annual budget process.

District staff have also commenced discussion and analysis of potential structural deficit reduction strategies. These will also be consulted on in meetings with stakeholders along with the multi-year plans.





Engagement with Stakeholders, Trustees, and the Community

As required by Administrative Procedure 503 and Administrative Procedure 500 – Annual Budget, all District stakeholder groups will continue to be involved in the budget development process. With the structural deficit focus in the development of the 2023-2024 operating fund budget the plan is for group meetings of stakeholders in late January 2023 and early February 2023 to discuss structural deficit reduction strategies and multi-year plans in these meetings. This is a departure from the past few years where meetings were held with each stakeholder group individually. While the previous meetings were valued as providing opportunities for more open discussion of budget concerns, the new structure of group meetings will provide a more district-wide consideration of the budgetary impact of the strategies in the multi-year plans presented and feedback on structural deficit reduction strategies. They will also provide a forum for stakeholders to suggest budget additions and reallocations. It is important to note that any proposed additions to the budget must be offset with savings elsewhere in accordance with the balanced budget requirement. The feedback from these group meetings will be provided back to stakeholders prior to being presented to the Finance Committee in February.

As in the past, trustees will have the option to attend these meetings. District staff think the presence of a single trustee at the stakeholder meetings in the role of observer is appropriate and will help to inform discussions at future meetings of the Finance Committee when they report back on their observations. Accordingly, trustees are asked to inform the Secretary Treasurer's office which meetings from the dates in the timeline in the Discussion Matters section below they would like to attend, and a schedule will be developed.

After the multi-year plans and structural deficit reduction strategies have been presented to the Finance Committee in February, an engagement survey will be distributed which will be kept open for two weeks to allow the community to provide comment on the structural deficit reduction strategies and multi-year plans as well as any proposed additions to the budget and offsetting reallocations.

OPERATING FUND BUDGET DEVELOPMENT PROCESS

In developing the balanced budget for the operating fund for 2023-2024 the overall goal is to provide, to the extent possible, a comparable level of programs and services as provided in 2022-2023, while recognizing that additional cost pressures, structural deficit reduction strategies and first year initiatives from the multi-year plans will need to be considered in producing a balanced budget.

The development of the operating fund budget for 2023-2024 will include the following processes:

- the development and approval of the 2022-2023 amended annual budget
- the development of base budget expenditures
 - return the amended budget expenditures to base budget levels
 - remove one-time budget overages/savings not continuing
 - add overages/savings that are continuing
 - o add known cost pressures
 - add the cost impact of enrolment changes





- the development of preliminary funding estimate
 - the development of enrolment projections for the 2023-2024 school year to produce preliminary Ministry funding grant
 - o changes in other revenue sources
- the creation of the balanced status quo budget
- inclusion of structural deficit reduction strategies and additional costs included in multi-year plans
- consideration of using prior years' surpluses to balance the budget

Amended Budget

The Finance Department has been working on the amended budget for the 2022-2023 school year since September. Information on the status of the amended budget will be brought to the Finance Committee in January and February in the form of financial updates and forecasted results for the balance of the year. At the February 15, 2023 meeting the Committee will be asked to recommend approval of the 2022-2023 Amended Annual Budget to the Board.





Enrolment Projections

Each year, the District is required to submit enrolment projections for the next three years to the Ministry by February 15th and will consist of the following:

- school-aged children who are not enrolled in either distance learning or continuing education programs as of September 30
- students enrolled in distance learning and continuing education programs as of September 30,
 February 28 and May 31
- elementary and secondary summer school students
- non-graduated adults as of September 30
- students with special needs as of September 30 and February 28
- Indigenous students who are not "status First Nations living on reserve" as of September 30
- students who are being provided with ELL support as of September 30
- refugees as of September 30 and February 28.

The enrolment projections supplied to the Ministry in February provide the District with a preliminary funding estimate for the next school year. They will also inform the budget process in terms of formulating preliminary staffing levels and resource supports.

Status Quo Budget

The amended operating fund budget for 2022-2023 will serve as the base for the operating fund budget for 2023-2024. This is the budget which assumes to provide the same level of service and programming as has been provided in the current year, adjusted back to base levels and incorporating all known and assumed changes in revenues and expenditures. The process of developing the base or status quo budget is as follows:

- The expenditure component of the amended budget for the current year serves as the base and is adjusted for the following elements to produce a status quo expenditure budget:
 - the impact that enrolment changes will have on the following year's staffing levels;
 - the addition of known changes in expenditure levels, such as changes in benefit rates and necessary school and department requests;
 - the addition of other known cost pressures, such as utilities increases and wage lifts for exempt staff and principals and vice-principals;
 - o the removal of one-time or non-continuing expenditure items;
- The revenue component of the amended budget for the current year is adjusted for the following to produce a revenue budget for the following year:
 - expected enrolment changes in all Ministry-funded student and adult categories;
 - projected growth or decline in the revenue in the International Student Program;
 - o known changes in provincial core or supplementary funding (after the Ministry announcement in mid-March);
 - expected or planned changes in local revenue.





- The status quo expenditure budget and the preliminary revenue budget are then compared to determine whether a status quo budget surplus or deficit exists
- The operating fund status quo will then be balanced and presented to the Board of Education in early April 2023 for further conversations with the Finance Committee and Board Committee of the Whole meetings throughout April.

CONCLUSION

The budget process outlined in this document represents a transparent and accountable way to develop the operating fund budget for the Vancouver School Board. The process will be challenging due to the existence of the structural deficit and expected cost pressures, particularly those related to inflation and rising utility costs. In developing the budget, the focus should be on the foundational direction for budget development in Goal 2 of the Education Plan where "increasing equity" is addressed as "Improving stewardship of the district's resources by focusing on effectiveness, efficiency, and sustainability."

It is incumbent on the Board to undertake a focused examination of how the limited resources are being allocated in the system so that the cost structure, which is largely based on staffing and high building operational costs, more closely reflects the funding received. That examination must look at the budget structurally and identify strategies where programs can be delivered more cost effectively, where the cost of maintaining buildings can be reduced, where the cost of delivering educational programming per student can be reduced and where costs that are not needed in the budget can be removed. Failure to do so will result in the eventual inability of the District to create a balanced budget, as required by the *School Act*.

The Senior Team believes the budget development process outlined in this document lays the foundation for looking at resource allocation from a district perspective, striving for equity for students and creating a cost consciousness; all of which will serve to enhance learning experiences for Vancouver students.

RECOMENDATION

IT IS RECOMMENDED THAT:

The Finance Committee recommends that the budget process and timeline presented at the November 23, 2022, meeting of the Committee be approved by the Board of Education.

Under PSAB standards the annual budget will have to be submitted in the following format:

- Statement 2 Revenue and Expense
- Statement 4 Change in Net Financial Assets (Debt)
- Schedule 2 Operating Revenue and Expense
- Schedule 2A Schedule of Operating Revenue by Source
- Schedule 2B Schedule of Operating Expense by Source
- Schedule 2C Operating Expense by Function, Program and Object
- Schedule 3 Special Purpose Revenue and Expense
- Schedule 3A Changes in Special Purpose Funds
- Schedule 4 Capital Revenue and Expense

The following is a brief description of the purpose of these statements and schedules:

- Statement 2 "Annual Budget Revenue and Expense" consolidates all revenue and expense by function for the operating fund (Schedule 2), the special purpose fund (Schedule 3) and the capital fund (Schedule 4). The presentation of expense by function rather than by object is a change required under PSAB. The total budget bylaw is presented at the end and includes expenses and asset purchases from all funds.
- Statement 4 "Annual Budget Change in Net Financial Assets (Debt)" is a PSAB statement that is required to produce the budget figures for presentation in the audited financial statements.
- Schedules 2 2C report operating fund revenue and expense. Schedule 2 consists of the budgeted revenues and expenses for the fund and show a balanced position. Schedule 2A is a more detailed breakdown of the budgeted operating fund revenue by source. Schedule 2B is a breakdown of the budgeted operating fund expenses by source. Schedule 2C provides a further breakdown of the budgeted operating fund expenses by function, program and object.
- Schedules 3 and 3A reports the special purpose fund revenue and expenses.
- Schedule 4 reports revenue and expense in the capital fund.

Statement of Financial Information 2021-2022

Reference to GOAL 1:
Education Plan OBJECTIVE:

The Vancouver School Board will improve student achievement, physical and mental well-being, and belonging by:

Ensuring the alignment among school district, and provincial

education plans.

INTRODUCTION

In accordance with Section 2(3) of the *Financial Information Act* a school district must, within 6 months after the end of each fiscal year, prepare a statement of financial information (SOFI) for that fiscal year. Section 2(1) of the *Financial Information Act* directs that the statement of financial information be prepared in a form and containing information prescribed by the Lieutenant Governor in Council. This requirement is detailed in *Financial Information Regulation 371/93*.

This report contains a recommendation.

BACKGROUND

Financial Information Regulation 371/93 provides that the statements of financial information required by Section 2 of the Financial Information Act must be prepared in the form set out in Schedule 1 of the regulation. In addition to the audited financial statements the following additional schedules are also included, as stipulated in the Regulation:

- Schedule of debts.
- Schedule of guarantee and indemnity agreements.
- Schedule of employees earning greater than \$75,000, the total remuneration paid to the employee and the total amount paid for the employee's expenses and a consolidated total of remuneration paid to all other employees.
- Schedule of severance agreement, and a
- Schedule identifying suppliers of goods and services greater than \$25,000 and a consolidated total of all other payments made to suppliers of goods and services during the year.

The financial statements contained in the SOFI report have been prepared by management in accordance with the accounting requirements of British Columbia Treasury Board Regulations 257/2010 and 198/2011 as directed by Section 23.1 of the Budget Transparency and Accountability Act of British





Columbia. The financial statements are management's responsibility and have been prepared objectively and with integrity. Management is also responsible for implementing and maintaining a system of internal controls.

The external auditors, KPMG LLP, conducted an independent examination, in accordance with Canadian generally accepted auditing standards, and expressed their opinion on the financial statements that are included in the SOFI Report. As stated, the *Financial Information Act* requires additional schedules be included as part of the SOFI Report. However, the external auditors' examination does not extend to these other schedules.

DISCUSSION

Financial Information Regulation 371/93 prescribes the following definitions for the information included in the SOFI Report:

Debt

Long term debts secured by debt instruments such as debentures, mortgages, and bonds.

Guarantee and Indemnity Agreements

Any financial guarantee and indemnity agreements in force which required government approval prior to being given under the *Indemnities and Guarantees Regulation*.

Severance

An agreement made in lieu of a notice period, between an employee and employer, that may provide for one or more of the following:

- 1. A lump sum payment or periodic payments.
- 2. Payment based on the employee's base salary, benefits, and length of service.
- 3. Compensation, except compensation in the form of an early retirement incentive plan.

Remuneration

The amounts listed under the column "remuneration" are defined as follows:

compensation means the sum of gross salary plus the value of benefits, where the employee's remuneration exceeds \$75,000.

remuneration

includes any form of salary, wages, bonuses, gratuities, taxable benefits, payment into trust or any form of income deferral paid by the corporation to the employee or on behalf of the employee during the fiscal year being reported upon, whether or not such remuneration is reported under the Income Tax Act (Canada), and does not include anything payable under a severance agreement.





Employee Expenses

The amount reported under expenses:

includes travel expenses, memberships, tuition, relocation, vehicle leases, extraordinary hiring expenses, registration fees and similar amounts paid directly to an employee, or to a third party on behalf of the employee, and which has not been included in remuneration and is not limited to expenses that are generally perceived as perquisites, or bestowing personal benefit, and may include expenditures required for employees to perform their job functions.

It is important to note that the report does not include any recovery of expenses. If an employee reimburses the District for any portion of an expenditure, the reimbursed amount is not deducted in the SOFI report. If an external grant reimburses the district for a portion (or all) of the costs, the gross amount of the expenditure is reported, and the recovery is not offset.

Supplier Payments

The Act defines the amounts to be included for payments made for the provision of goods or services as follows:

The schedule of payments for the provision of goods and services must list the aggregate amount paid by the corporation during the fiscal year for the supply of goods or services rendered if the aggregate amount paid to each individual supplier exceeds \$25 000.

A significant portion of the supplier payments represents contributions to pension and employee benefit plans and contractors for capital projects. Payments for employer contributions for statutory deductions (EI, CPP etc.) and employee benefit plans are included in this schedule.

CONCLUSION

1 Authority and Purpose

The School District, established on April 12, 1946, operates under authority of the *School Act* of British Columbia as a corporation under the name of "The Board of Education of School District No. 39 (Vancouver)", and operates as "School District No. 39 (Vancouver)." A Board of Education (Board) elected for a four-year term governs the School District. The School District provides educational programs to students enrolled in schools in the District, and is principally funded by the Province of British Columbia through the Ministry of Education and Child Care. School District No. 39 is exempt from federal and provincial income taxes.

2 Summary of Significant Accounting Policies

a) Basis of Accounting

These financial statements have been prepared in accordance with Section 23.1 of the *Budget Transparency and Accountability Act of the Province of British Columbia*. This Section requires that the financial statements be prepared in accordance with Canadian public sector accounting standards except in regard to the accounting for government transfers as set out in Notes 2(f) and 2(n).

In November 2011, Treasury Board provided a directive through Restricted Contributions Regulation 198/2011 providing direction for the reporting of restricted contributions whether they are received or receivable by the School District before or after this regulation was in effect.

As noted in Notes 2(f) and 2(n), Section 23.1 of the *Budget Transparency and Accountability Act* and its related regulations require the School District to recognize government transfers for the acquisition of capital assets into revenue on the same basis as the related amortization expense. As these transfers do not contain stipulations that create a liability, Canadian public sector accounting standards would require these grants to be fully recognized into revenue.

b) Cash and Cash Equivalents

Cash and cash equivalents include cash and securities that are readily convertible to known amounts of cash and that are subject to an insignificant risk of change in value. These cash equivalents generally have a maturity of three months or less at acquisition and are held for the purpose of meeting short-term cash commitments rather than for investing.

c) Accounts Receivable

Accounts receivable are measured at amortized cost and shown net of allowance for doubtful accounts.

d) Portfolio Investments

The School District has investments in Guaranteed Investment Certificates (GIC's) and bonds that have a period to maturity of greater than three months at the time of acquisition. These investments are not quoted in an active market and are reported at amortized cost, and the associated transaction costs are added to the carrying value of these investments upon initial recognition. Transaction costs are incremental costs directly attributable to the acquisition or issuance of a financial asset.

e) Unearned Revenue

Unearned revenue includes tuition fees received for courses to be delivered in future periods, receipt of proceeds for services or products to be delivered in a future period and the remaining balance of a 99-year ground lease. For tuition fees and the receipt of proceeds for services or products to be delivered, revenue will be recognized in that future period when the courses, services, or products are provided. For the ground lease, revenue will be recognized on a straight-line basis over the remaining term of the lease.

f) Deferred Revenue and Deferred Capital Revenue

Deferred revenue includes contributions received with stipulations that meet the description of restricted contributions in the Restricted Contributions Regulation 198/2011 issued by Treasury Board. When restrictions are met, deferred revenue is recognized as revenue in the fiscal year in a manner consistent with the circumstances and evidence used to support the initial recognition of the contributions received as a liability, as detailed in Note 2(n).

Funding received for the acquisition of depreciable tangible capital assets is recorded as deferred capital revenue and amortized over the life of the asset acquired as revenue in the statement of operations. This accounting treatment is not consistent with the requirements of Canadian public sector accounting standards which require that government transfers be recognized as revenue when approved by the transferor and eligibility criteria have been met, unless the transfer contains a stipulation that creates a liability, in which case the transfer is recognized as revenue over the period that the liability is extinguished.

g) Employee Future Benefits

i) Post-employment benefits

The School District provides certain post-employment benefits, including vested and non-vested benefits, for certain employees pursuant to certain contracts and union agreements. The School District accrues its obligations and related costs, including both vested and non-vested benefits under employee future benefit plans. Benefits include vested sick leave, accumulating non-vested sick leave, early retirement, retirement/severance, vacation, overtime and death benefits. The benefits cost is actuarially determined using the projected unit credit method pro-rated on service and using management's best estimate of expected salary escalation, termination rates, retirement rates and mortality.

The discount rate used to measure obligations is based on the cost of borrowing. The cumulative unrecognized actuarial gains and losses are amortized over the expected average remaining service lifetime of active employees covered under the plan.

The most recent valuation of the obligation was performed at March 31, 2022 and projected to March 31, 2025. The next valuation will be performed at March 31, 2025 for use at June 30, 2025. For the purposes of determining the financial position of the plans and the employee future benefit costs, a measurement date of March 31 was adopted for all periods subsequent to July 1, 2004.

ii) Pension Plans

The School District and its employees make contributions to the Teachers' Pension Plan and Municipal Pension Plan. The plans are multi-employer plans where assets and obligations are not separated. The costs are expensed as incurred.

h) Tangible Capital Assets

- Tangible capital assets acquired or constructed are recorded at cost which includes amounts
 that are directly related to the acquisition, design, construction, development, improvement
 or betterment of the assets. Cost also includes overhead directly attributable to construction,
 as well as interest costs that are directly attributable to the acquisition or construction of the
 asset.
- Donated tangible capital assets are recorded at their fair market value on the date of
 donation, except in circumstances where fair value cannot be reasonably determined in
 which case the assets are recognized at nominal value. Transfers of capital assets from
 related parties are recorded at carrying value.
- Work-in-progress is recorded as an acquisition to the applicable asset class at substantial completion.
- Tangible capital assets are written down to residual value when conditions indicate they no longer contribute to the ability of the School District to provide services or when the value of future economic benefits associated with the sites and buildings are less than their net book value. The write-downs are accounted for as expenses in the Statement of Operations.
- Buildings that are demolished or destroyed are written-off.
- Works of art, historic assets and other intangible assets are not recorded as assets in these financial statements.

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• The cost, less residual value, of tangible capital assets (excluding sites), is amortized on a straight-line basis over the estimated useful life of the asset. It is management's responsibility to determine the appropriate useful lives for tangible capital assets. These useful lives are reviewed on a regular basis or if significant events indicate the need to revise.

i) Asset Retirement Obligations

Effective July 1, 2022 the School District adopted PS 3280, Asset Retirement Obligations.

A liability is recognized when, as at the financial reporting date:

- (a) there is a legal obligation to incur retirement costs in relation to a tangible capital asset;
- (b) the past transaction or event giving rise to the liability has occurred;
- (c) it is expected that future economic benefits will be given up; and
- (d) a reasonable estimate of the amount can be made

Liabilities are recognized for statutory, contractual or legal obligations associated with the retirement of tangible capital assets when those obligations result from the acquisition, construction, development or normal operation of the assets. The obligations are measured initially at fair value, determined using present value methodology, and the resulting costs capitalized into the carrying amount of the related tangible capital asset. In subsequent periods, the liability is adjusted for accretion and any changes in the amount or timing of the underlying future cash flows. The capitalized asset retirement cost is amortized on the same basis as the related asset and accretion expense is included in the Statement of Operations.

j) Capital Leases

Leases that, from the point of view of the lessee, transfer substantially all the benefits and risks incident to ownership of the property to the School District are considered capital leases. These are accounted for as an asset and an obligation. Capital lease obligations are recorded at the present value of the minimum lease payments excluding executory costs, e.g., insurance or maintenance costs. The discount rate used to determine the present value of the lease payments is the lower of the School District's rate for incremental borrowing or the interest rate implicit in the lease.

All other leases are accounted for as operating leases and the related payments are charged to expenses as incurred.

k) Prepaid Expenses

Prepaid annual maintenance contracts, prepaid rent, membership dues, and medical benefit plan premiums are included as a prepaid expense and stated at acquisition cost, and are charged to expense over the periods expected to benefit from it.

1) Supplies Inventory

Supplies inventory held for consumption or use are recorded at the lower of historical cost and replacement cost.

m) Funds and Reserves

Certain amounts, as approved by the Board, are set aside in accumulated surplus for future operating and capital purposes. Transfers to and from funds and reserves are an adjustment to the respective fund when approved.

n) Revenue Recognition

Revenues are recorded on an accrual basis in the period in which the transactions or events occurred that gave rise to the revenues, the amounts are considered to be collectible and can be reasonably estimated.

Contributions received, or where eligibility criteria have been met, are recognized as revenue except where the contribution meets the criteria for deferral as described below. Eligibility criteria are the criteria that the School District has to meet in order to receive the contributions, including authorization by the transferring government.

For contributions subject to a legislative or contractual stipulation or restriction as to their use, revenue is recognized as follows:

- non-capital contributions for specific purposes are recorded as deferred revenue and recognized as revenue in the year related expenses are incurred;
- contributions restricted for site acquisitions are recorded as revenue when the sites are purchased; and
- contributions restricted for tangible capital assets acquisitions other than sites are recorded as deferred capital revenue and amortized over the useful life of the related assets.

Donated tangible capital assets other than sites are recorded at fair market value and amortized over the useful lives of the assets. Donated sites are recorded as revenue at fair market value when received or receivable.

The accounting treatment for restricted contributions is not consistent with the requirements of Canadian public sector accounting standards which require that governments transfers be recognized as revenue when approved by the transferor and eligibility criteria have been met, unless the transfer contains a stipulation that meets the criteria for liability recognition, in which case the transfer is recognized over the period that the liability is extinguished.

Revenue related to fees or services received in advance of the fee being earned or the service is performed is deferred and recognized when the fee is earned or service performed.

Investment income is reported in the period earned. When required by the funding party or related Act, investment income earned on deferred revenue is added to the deferred revenue balance.

o) Expenditures

Expenses are reported on an accrual basis. The cost of all goods consumed and services received during the year is expensed.

Categories of Salaries

- Principals, Vice-Principals, and Directors of Instruction employed under an administrative officer contract are categorized as Principals and Vice-Principals.
- The Superintendent, Deputy Superintendent, Associate Superintendent, Secretary-Treasurer, Trustees and other employees excluded from union contracts are categorized as Other Professionals.

Allocation of Costs

- Operating expenses are reported by function, program, and object. Whenever possible expenditures are determined by actual identification. Additional costs pertaining to specific instructional programs, such as special and aboriginal education, are allocated to these programs. All other costs are allocated to related programs.
- Actual salaries of personnel assigned to two or more functions or programs are allocated based on the time spent in each function and program. School-based clerical salaries are allocated to school administration and partially to other programs to which they may be assigned. Principals' and Vice-Principals' salaries are allocated to school administration and may be partially allocated to other programs to recognize their other responsibilities.
- Employee benefits and allowances are allocated to the same programs, and in the same proportions, as the individual's salary.
- Supplies and services are allocated based on actual program identification.

p) Financial Instruments

A contract establishing a financial instrument creates, at its inception, rights and obligations to receive or deliver economic benefits. The financial assets and financial liabilities portray these rights and obligations in the financial statements. The School District recognizes a financial instrument when it becomes a party to a financial instrument contract.

Financial instruments consist of cash and cash equivalents, portfolio investments, accounts receivable, accounts payable and other current liabilities.

Except for portfolio investments in equity instruments quoted in an active market, or items designated by management, that are recorded at fair value, all financial assets and liabilities are recorded at cost or amortized cost and the associated transaction costs are added to the carrying value of these investments upon initial recognition. Transaction costs are incremental costs directly attributable to the acquisition or issue of a financial asset or a financial liability.

The School District has not invested in any equity instruments that are actively quoted in the market and has not designated any financial instruments to be recorded at fair value. The School District has no instruments in the fair value category.

For financial instruments measured using amortized cost, the effective interest rate method is used to determine interest revenue or expense. Interest and dividends attributable to financial instruments are reported in the statement of operations.

Unless otherwise noted, it is management's opinion that the School District is not exposed to significant interest, currency or credit risks arising from its financial instruments. The fair values of these financial instruments approximate their carrying value, unless otherwise noted.

All financial assets except derivatives are tested annually for impairment. When financial assets are impaired, impairment losses are recorded in the statement of operations. A write-down of a portfolio investment to reflect a loss in value is not reversed for a subsequent increase in value.

q) Measurement Uncertainty

Preparation of financial statements in accordance with the basis of accounting described in Note 2(a) requires management to make estimates and assumptions that impact reported amounts of assets and liabilities at the date of the financial statements and revenues and expenses during the reporting periods. Areas requiring the use of management estimates relate to the potential impairment of assets, liabilities for contaminated sites, rates for amortization and estimated employee future benefits. Actual results could differ from those estimates.

r) Liability for Contaminated Sites

Contaminated sites are a result of contamination being introduced into air, soil, water or sediment of a chemical, organic or radioactive material or live organism that exceeds an environmental standard. The liability is recorded net of any expected recoveries. A liability for remediation of contaminated sites is recognized when a site is not in productive use and all the following criteria are met:

- an environmental standard exists:
- contamination exceeds the environmental standard;
- the School District:
 - o is directly responsible; or
 - o accepts responsibility;
- it is expected that future economic benefits will be given up; and
- a reasonable estimate of the amount can be made.

The liability is recognized as management's estimate of the cost of post-remediation including operation, maintenance and monitoring that are an integral part of the remediation strategy for a contaminated site.

3 Other Receivables

Other Receivables includes an amount for unpaid ground lease revenue. Due to uncertainty surrounding the collectability of this amount it is included in Allowance for Doubtful Accounts (refer to Note 18, Contingent Assets).

As at June 30, 2022, there was work in progress of \$157,375,296 (2021: \$122,389,652) included in Buildings and Furniture & Equipment and not being amortized. Amortization of these assets will commence when the asset is put into service.

Included within tangible capital assets purchases is \$4,026,280 (2021: \$4,122,903) of assets acquired through capital lease.

12 Employee Pension Plans

The School District and its employees contribute to the Teachers' Pension Plan and Municipal Pension Plan (jointly trusteed pension plans). The boards of trustees for these plans, representing plan members and employers, are responsible for administering the pension plans, including investing assets and administering benefits. The plans are multi-employer defined benefit pension plans. Basic pension benefits are based on a formula. As at December 31, 2021, the Teachers' Pension Plan had about 50,000 active members and approximately 40,000 retired members. As of December 31, 2021, the Municipal Pension Plan had about 227,000 active members, including approximately 29,000 from school districts.

Every three years, an actuarial valuation is performed to assess the financial position of the plans and adequacy of plan funding. The actuary determines an appropriate combined employer and member contribution rate to fund the plans. The actuary's calculated contribution rate is based on the entry-age normal cost method, which produces the long-term rate of member and employer contributions sufficient to provide benefits for average future entrants to the plans. This rate may be adjusted for the amortization of any actuarial funding surplus and will be adjusted for the amortization of any unfunded actuarial liability.

The most recent actuarial valuation of the Teachers' Pension Plan as at December 31, 2020, indicated a \$1,584 million surplus for basic pension benefits on a going concern basis. The next valuation for the Teachers' Pension Plan will be as at December 31, 2023.

The most recent actuarial valuation for the Municipal Pension Plan as at December 31, 2018, indicated a \$2,866 million funding surplus for basic pension benefits on a going concern basis. The next valuation for the Municipal Pension Plan will be as at December 31, 2021, with results available in 2022.

The School District paid \$45,442,073 (2021 - \$45,249,461) for employer contributions to these plans in the year ended June 30, 2022.

Employers participating in the plans record their pension expense as the amount of employer contributions made during the fiscal year (defined contribution pension plan accounting). This is because the plans record accrued liabilities and accrued assets for each plan in aggregate, resulting in no consistent and reliable basis for allocating the obligation, assets and cost to individual employers participating in the plans.

13 Contractual Obligations

The School District has entered into a number of multiple-year contracts for the delivery of services and the construction of tangible capital assets. These contractual obligations will become liabilities in the future when the terms of the contracts are met.

18 Contingent Assets

In fiscal 2018-19 the School District entered into an agreement with BC Hydro for the sale of an underground air parcel at Lord Roberts Annex for the construction of an electrical substation. As a result of that sale, a contingent asset exists in the form of a construction lease starting August 1, 2024. The issuance of the construction lease in 2024 is dependent on BC Hydro receiving a Certificate of Public Convenience and Necessity from the British Columbia Utilities Commission for the construction of the substation. Originally the construction lease was to commence in 2023 but the School District has provided notice of a one-year delay to BC Hydro as per the terms of the agreement.

In January 2022 the School District received an arbitration award regarding the annual ground lease rent for the site on which Kingsgate Mall occupies. The District has invoiced the tenant annual rent based on the arbitration ruling. The tenant has appealed the arbitration decision and is paying a lower amount of rent. The collectability of the amount invoiced is dependent on the outcome of the appeal.

Contingent assets are not recorded in the financial statements.

19 Contingent Liabilities

As per a directive from the Ministry of Education and Child Care, any funding for Remedy with the Classroom Enhancement Fund requires an agreement for payout with the School District's teachers' associations. On June 30, 2022 the District did not have agreements with the teachers' associations, and the amount and likelihood of a payout are not measurable.

In the ordinary course of operations, the School District has legal proceedings brought against it. It is the opinion of management that final determination of these claims will not have a material effect on the financial position or operations of the School District.

20 Economic Dependence

The operations of the School District are dependent on continued funding from the Ministry of Education and Child Care and various governmental agencies to carry out its programs. These financial statements have been prepared on a going concern basis.

21 Related Party Transactions

The School District is related through common ownership to all Province of British Columbia ministries, agencies, school districts, health authorities, colleges, universities and crown corporations. The School District is also related to key management personnel who have the authority and responsibility for planning, directing and controlling the activities of the District. The key management personnel are the Board of Education, Superintendent of Schools and the Secretary Treasurer. All transactions with these entities, unless disclosed separately, are considered to be in the normal course of operations and are recorded at the exchange amount.

22 Risk Management

The School District has exposure to the following risks from its use of financial instruments: credit risk, market risk and liquidity risk.

The Board ensures that the School District has identified its risks and ensures that management monitors and controls them.

a) Credit risk

Credit risk is the risk of financial loss to an institution if a customer or counterparty to a financial instrument fails to meet its contractual obligations. Such risks arise principally from certain financial assets held consisting of cash, amounts receivable and investments.

The School District is exposed to credit risk in the event of non-performance by a debtor. This risk is mitigated as most amounts receivable are due from the Province and are collectible.

It is management's opinion that the School District is not exposed to significant credit risk associated with its cash deposits and investments as they are held by recognized British Columbia institutions and the School District invests solely in guaranteed investment certificates, term deposits, Senior Government Bonds and the Central Deposit Program of BC.

b) Market risk

Market risk is the risk that the fair value or future cash flows of a financial instrument will fluctuate because of changes in market prices. Market risk is comprised of currency risk and interest rate risk.

Currency risk is the risk that the fair value or future cash flows of a financial instrument will fluctuate because of changes in the foreign exchange rates.

It is management's opinion that the School District is not exposed to significant currency risk, as amounts held and purchases made in foreign currency are insignificant.

Interest rate risk is the risk that the fair value or future cash flows of a financial instrument will fluctuate because of changes in the market interest rates. The School District is exposed to interest rate risk through its investments. It is management's opinion that the School District is not exposed to significant interest rate risk because it invests solely in guaranteed investment certificates, term deposits, and Senior Government Bonds.

c) Liquidity risk

Liquidity risk is the risk that the School District will not be able to meet its financial obligations as they become due.

The School District manages liquidity risk by continually monitoring actual and forecasted cash flows from operations and anticipated investing activities to ensure, as far as possible, that it will always have sufficient liquidity to meet its liabilities when due, under both normal and stressed conditions, without incurring unacceptable losses or risking damage to the School District's reputation.

Risk management and insurance services for all School Districts in British Columbia are provided by the Risk Management Branch of the Ministry of Finance. There have been no changes to risk exposure from 2021 related to credit, market or liquidity risks.

STATEMENT OF FINANCIAL INFORMATION EXPLANATION OF DIFFERENCES TO AUDITED FINANCIAL STATEMENTS FOR THE YEAR ENDED JUNE 30, 2022

The salaries paid to employees as well as the payments disbursed to suppliers for goods and services and employee benefit premiums are disclosed on the audited financial statements as expenses, net revenues, capitalized costs or changes in accounts receivable and accounts payable.

The differences between the audited financial statements (Statement 2 – Statement of Operations) and the combined totals of the Schedule of Remuneration and Expenses and the Schedule of Payments Made for the Provision of Goods and Services are primarily as follows:

- Amounts reflected in the schedules are prepared on a cash basis, whereas expenditures included on the financial statements are prepared on an accrual basis.
- The list of payments to suppliers may include 100% of the GST/PST paid, whereas the expenditures in the financial statements are shown net of the GST rebate.
- The taxable benefits are included in the Remuneration column of the Schedule of Remuneration and Expenses. The same amount is included in the Schedule of Payments Made for the Provision of Goods and Services for payments made to benefit carriers.
- Payments to suppliers may be reported in the Financial Statements as Prepaid Expenses, Tangible Capital Assets, or Services and Supplies, as appropriate.
- The schedule includes payments for capital purchases, related to the employer portion of benefits (other than CPP and EI) as well as goods and services.

INTRODUCTION

This report provides the financial results of the operating fund for the three months ended September 30, 2022, compared to the budget for the same period.

This report is provided for information.

BACKGROUND

The School District's financial activities are accounted for using Public Sector Accounting Board ("PSAB") reporting standards. The financial activities incurred by the District are recorded in three different funds: the operating fund, the capital fund and numerous special purpose funds. Together they form a consolidated Statement of Revenue and Expense for the District. This year-to-date financial report is for the operating fund only. The operating fund contains the grants supplied by the Ministry of Education and Child Care and other sources of revenue and includes expenses related to the provision of educational services.

ANALYSIS

The operating fund financial results for the quarter ending September 30, 2022, are compared to a year-to-date budget. This format is new for the District this year and provides a better comparator to the actual results than using the annual budget. Previous reports to the Finance Committee compared the year-to-date results to the annual budget and the prior year year-to-date amounts. That analysis resulted in a





detailed report that explained the variance amounts, from a numerical perspective but not the more specific reasons behind the variances. In the current report, staff will provide operational updates that better explain the variances for the Committee. The year-to-date budget is a new concept for the District and was determined using known information about the budget categories and historical trend analysis and will continue to be refined throughout the year. The following table provides the assumptions used in creating the year-to-date budget. Subsequent reports will list this table as an appendix:

regular operations this quarter of \$8.70 million, a \$0.99 million unfavourable variance from the year-to-date budget of \$7.72 million.



A deficit at the end of September is expected based on the Ministry of Education and Child Care's (MECC) funding disbursement schedule, presented in the following chart, where only 11.5% of the Ministry grant





is received in the first quarter and the remaining 88.6% is received in the second, third and fourth quarters of the fiscal year.



REVENUE


The first quarter revenue is on budget, with a small favorable variance of \$0.04 million due to increases in tuition fees and investment income, offset by lower revenue from rentals and leases. The additional tuition fee is from 103 more International Students enrolled compared to the budget.

In the 2022-2023 budget, the assumption for investment income was for the Bank of Canada to increase the central bank rate 1.50% between March 2022 and June 2023. To combat inflation numbers, the Bank has taken an aggressive approach to curb spending by raising the central bank rate 2.75% between March 2022 and September 2022. The higher interest rates have produced a favourable variance of \$0.06 million in the quarter as the interest on funds deposited with the Ministry of Finance Central Deposit Program and the Bank of Montreal are based off the Prime Lending Rate.

The offset to the increased revenue is the lower-than-expected revenue from Rentals and Leases as the budget assumption is that rentals would return to the pre-pandemic levels. Although revenue has increased, as shown in the chart below, the demand is not at the same level as pre-pandemic activity this quarter.







EXPENSES

Salaries and Benefits

The budget assumption in the table above with respect to salaries refers to a combination of actual number of workdays in the quarter and historical trend analysis for summer work. When looking at the various categories of salaries it is important to recognize that the different employee groups work various times in the first quarter of a fiscal year. This will result in a different number of workdays in the quarter and throughout the year. Educational Assistants and Teachers are primarily 10-month employees (September to June) so will have fewer workdays in the quarter than Principals and Vice-Principals and Other Professionals who are primarily 12-month employees (July to June). The Support Staff employee group is a mix of 10 and 12-month employees.

The year-to-date salaries expense for the first quarter in total is \$0.07 million under budget. Unfavourable variances for Principals and Vice-Principals, Teachers, Education Assistants and Other Professionals totalling \$0.13 million, and for Substitutes of \$0.59 million are offset by a favourable variance of \$0.65 million on Support Staff salaries.

The favourable variance in Support Staff salaries of \$0.65 million in the quarter is primarily due to the reversal of a year-end accrual of \$0.56 million for the salaries related to facilities work for Annual Facilities Grant (AFG) projects. These work in progress salary costs at year end are accrued and charged to the operating fund because the District cannot record a receivable from the Ministry for funding related to the AFG work, and the District cannot have a deficit in the AFG grant, which is a special purpose fund. When the funding for these projects is received after year end, the accrued salary costs are charged to the respective AFG projects.

The unfavourable variance of \$0.59 million in substitute salaries is due to increased absences related to a higher use of sick leave. When the staff member that is absent for the day continues to receive a wage, the cost of the replacement is charged to substitutes. The cost of a replacement is charged to the salary account if the absent person is not being paid.





The favourable variance of \$0.13 million for the quarter in the District's benefits expense is due to lower costs for certain wage sensitive benefits in the latter half of the calendar year. As many employees will have reached their maximum deduction for Employment Insurance and Canada Pension Plan contributions, the Districts' expense will be lower in the first and second quarters of the school year (July to December), showing a positive variance (surplus) as the actual benefit rate of 27.07% is lower than the budgeted rate of 27.38%.

Services and Supplies

Apart from supplies and utilities the expenses in Services and Supplies show a total favourable variance of \$0.03 million in the quarter. The unfavourable variance in the Supplies category of \$0.68 million is a result of spending that occurred earlier in the year (\$0.49 million) than what was determined in the historical trend analysis when determining the YTD budget.

The unfavourable variance of \$0.29 million in utilities expense in the quarter is due to the rising costs of natural gas, electricity, and water and sewer services. The following chart was presented by the Director of Facilities at the Facilities Planning Committee meeting on October 5, 2022:

Note: Costs shown here do not include waste management, recycling, and organics diversion costs which are included as a utility item in the VSB financial statements.

The Annual Budget for utilities in 2022-2023 is \$8.3 million and the projection in the chart (developed after the budget was approved) is \$9.5 million. The Amended Budget will reflect the increase in utilities costs.

The District uses operating funds to purchase capital assets and enter into capital leases. The unfavourable variance for this quarter is due to the timing of entering into leases or purchasing assets compared to previous years as the YTD budget is based on the historical trend of purchases throughout the year.
