What is a PAC?

- ✓ Under the School Act, a Parents' Advisory Council is the officially recognized collective voice of parents/guardians within a school community.
- ✓ Every school has only one PAC that includes all parents/guardians as members.
- ✓ PAC meetings are intended to provide opportunities within each school community for parents/guardians to engage in dialogue with the principal (or designate) around matters affecting the school.

How does a PAC work?

- ✓ The elected officials of the PAC work with the parent/guardian community and the principal (or designate) to set monthly meeting agendas.
- ✓ The principal (or designate) attends meetings as a non-voting member of the PAC Executive.
- ✓ PAC meetings are an opportunity for parents/guardians to discuss and provide advice and input to school and District administration around matters important to the school community.
- ✓ Information about our PAC and PAC meetings is available on our school website.

What is the purpose of a PAC?

- ✓ Advise the school and District around matters relating to the school and/or school programs, policies, plans and activities
- ✓ Organize activities, events and parent/guardian education
- ✓ Encourage parent/guardian participation in the school
- ✓ Communicate with parents/guardians and promote co-operation between home and school

For the benefit of all students!!

PACs...

- ✓ PACs strive to represent the diversity within their communities.
- ✓ The work of the PAC must be unbiased in respect of race, colour, religion, politics, family status, gender, sexual orientation or physical or mental ability.
- ✓ PAC members adhere to Board policies, administrative procedures and parent responsibilities as outlined in section 1.4 of the <u>District Student Code of Conduct</u> when in attendance at school and District functions (including online and digital events).

The PAC is not a forum for the discussion of individual students, school personnel, parents/guardians or other members of the school community.

What do you do if you have a question or concern about your child's experience at school?

- Most questions and concerns at schools are best dealt with by speaking or meeting directly with the employee(s) involved, usually your child's teacher.
- Employee email addresses are available on the school website.
- The school principal is available to support you if you have any challenges connecting with the employee(s) involved.
- If you are not comfortable understanding or expressing myself in English your principal can support you through the provision of a VSB Multicultural Liaison Worker in your native language.
- The process parents and students are asked to follow is outlined in VSB <u>AP 152</u> and the <u>Conflict</u> <u>Resolution Process for School-Based Concerns</u>.
