#### **School News**

## **February Highlights**

February 2015 included two school-wide performances. Scrap Arts Music transforms scrap into art and art into music. Their presentation was lively and engaging. Alida Kinne Starr is a Juno-nominated Hip Hop and spoken word artist who had the students creating rhythm and beat with their bodies and voices. In addition, we have an Artist in Residence working with division 6, field trips to Burnaby Art Gallery, and a presentation by UBC Health Professionals students for our grade 4, 5 and 6 students. Classes are continuing to work on a wide variety of projects emphasizing the new BC Education curriculum core competencies of Thinking, Communication, Personal and Social Development. Students are engaged in inquiry learning and increasingly demonstrating their understanding using technology. It is exciting and engaging work! One change that naturally follows from the new curriculum is a change in the way assessment will be done and communicated to parents. Students will become more involved in presenting their own learning and evaluating where they need to go next. You may start to see some changes even with our upcoming conferences. At our last Professional development day, Laurier hosted two other schools as we focused on Social Emotional Learning. SEL is becoming an area of increasing interest to educators as we see increased anxiety and stress in our students. The BC Centre for Ability has done a great deal of work in this area based on evidence that shows better outcomes for children and youth who have social emotional competence in 5 areas including: self-awareness, self-regulation/management, social awareness, relationship skills and problem-solving/social responsibility. While the mandate for the Centre for Ability is working with children and adults with disabilities, their work on social-Emotional Learning is applicable to all people, and is increasingly being used in many Vancouver schools. #### **2015-2016 - Registration**

At this time we have a total of 290 students registered for next year and we expect to have 12 divisions again. We currently have 298 students. We have quite a number of cross-boundary applications, including many kindergarten students and some international students. Before being able to accept any cross-boundary requests, we will be working closely with Human Resources to ensure that we will have sufficient space moving forward as our in-catchment numbers increase in the coming years. The Vancouver School Board is making every effort to provide information to families as soon as possible about September placements.
