PHARMACY TECHNICIAN

Program Outline

Students will learn to safely and accurately prepare and distribute pharmaceutical products, promote patient health, and communicate with health care professionals in a community or hospital pharmacy.

Students will learn to perform the role of a pharmacy technician within current legal, ethical, and professional standards. This program is regulated by the College of Pharmacists of British Columbia.

Application Process - apply in Grade 11

Start by visiting careerprograms.vsb.bc.ca to download an application. Students are encouraged to discuss the application with a school counsellor and family.

Orientation Session June

Specific details about the Orientation Session will be included in the acceptance letter. Students must attend along with a parent or guardian.

Program Location & Intake Dates

This 12 month program takes place at the VCC Broadway campus and starts in January.

A practicum is required for completion of the program. Students are expected to continue into Terms 2 and 3 to complete the program.

Additional Information

Eligibility

This program is available to students who hold Canadian citizenship or Permanent Resident status and who attend a Vancouver School Board school or alternative program.

Required Courses

A minimum of 70% in Foundations of Math 12 or Pre-Calculus 11 A minimum of 70% in Chemistry 11

A minimum of 70% in Anatomy & Physiology 12

A minimum of 80% in Language Arts 12

A minimum of 80% on the VCC Health Sciences Math Assessment

Funding Commitment

Tuition will be paid by the VSB for the first term. Students are expected to self-fund the remaining terms. Students are also expected to pay for program supplies, equipment, books, PPE, and other fees - approximately \$1700.
