GREAT BC SHAKEOUT EARTHQUAKE DRILL

October 21st at 2 pm, our school is participating in an earthquake drill and an emergency student reunification drill. This is our opportunity as school staff to practice and implement our emergency preparedness plans. The student reunification drill is ONLY for Kindergarten students. Kindergarten students attending out of school care will not be participating in student reunification; they will be dismissed and attend out of school care as usual. Grades 1-7 students will be dismissed as usual. Kindergarten families will receive more detailed information about student pick-up.

At approximately 2:20 pm, these guardians may line up at our established check-in gate with their photo ID.

Thank you again for completing the yellow emergency reunification form. Guardians identified on this form will be required to show photo ID in order to be reunited with their child. Our resources are limited for this drill regarding English speaking staff. If you think it would support the communication between the reunification guardian and our school staff, please consider sending a written note with the child's and teacher's name on it. We are very appreciative of our school community's involvement in our earthquake and reunification drill.

TEACHING and LEARNING

There are two types of common curricular goals in inclusive classes.

1. Core Competency Goals *these might also be called: 21st century skills, learner characteristics, traits & attitudes etc.

2. Curricular Content & Competency Goals *these might also be called: knowledge, skills & process, concepts etc.

Classroom teams have engaged in extensive planning to meet the learning needs of the group. We reference the planning structures of Dr. Shelley Moore and organize teaching and learning goals based on the students' responses to planned interventions and strategies. On September 24, staff engaged in further professional development regarding universal design for learning (UDL).



Communicating Student Learning (CSL)

Goal Setting Conferences will take place via MS Teams this Fall.
Please adjust your family schedule for Nov 17th & 18th as students will be dismissed at 2 pm.
Families will meet with the teacher online for 10-15 minutes on these days. Scheduling information will be sent out in a few weeks.
Teachers will communicate student progress no fewer than 5 times over the course of the year. Included in this: 2 written reports issued in January and June.





Many students read and discussed *Thank You Omu* by Oge Mora.

Teachers often use books as "provocations" to spark inquiry-based learning. Several classes followed themes of community and sharing as a result.

Omu makes a stew for dinner and its smell spreads throughout the neighbourhood. One by one, starting with a boy, members of the community knock on her door to ask her for some of the stew, which Omu always gives. When Omu is ready for dinner, there is no more stew left. However, the community then brings her food to show their gratitude. They eat together and have a dance party.
