Dickens Annex Philosophy

Child-centered learning (also called student-centered learning) is an approach to education focused on the needs of the students. It empowers students to take responsibility for their own learning. Student-centered approaches encourage student to develop skills to become active, responsible participants in their own learning. Student-centered learning is focused on each student's needs, abilities, interests and learning styles, placing the teacher as a facilitator of their learning. Teachers create an environment that nurtures the curiosity of children to grow and to develop into life-long learners.

Differentiated Instruction

Differentiated instruction involves meeting the needs and engaging learners while valuing different intelligences Differentiation can show us how to teach the same standards to a range of learners by using a variety of teaching modes.

Collaboration

Collaboration is at the core of the teaching at the Annex. Both the teachers and the students participate in collaborative activities. School events and programming encourage cross-curricular and crossgraded collaboration. To remain current in educational pedagogy, we are constantly working to meet our diverse learners' needs through best practice. To accomplish this, we hold weekly meetings, for planning and teaching group lessons and programs. Group language (literature-based language arts), Afternoon Program (student chosen science and social studies themes) are examples of how we work and learn together.

Authentic Assessment

Authentic assessment focusses on what each child can do. It is an ongoing process and is formative; it aids in the planning and directs the instruction. In the form of assessment, students are asked to perform real-world tasks that demonstrate the meaningful knowledge and application of skills learned.
