Welcome back to Franklin Elementary and a new school year to our students, families and staff. For those new students and families joining us, I would like to take this opportunity to welcome you to the Franklin Elementary School Community! What a beautiful summer we have had and, with any luck, we will have similar weather as we move into autumn. I certainly hope that you had an opportunity to spend some time relaxing

with family and friends over the summer!

As we continue to emerge from the pandemic and better understand the complexities of COVID 19 our start-up protocols will resemble prepandemic start-ups. We will continue to communicate the importance of monitoring daily health and remind our staff, other adults entering the school, parents, caregivers, and students that they should not come to school if they are sick and unable to participate fully in routine activities. Students who become ill during the school day will be asked to wear a mask and wait in a supervised area, away from other students, until they can be picked up by a parent or guardian. Similar to the previous 2 years, our students will be expected to continue follow the traffic flow rules in the building and continue to diligently wash and sanitize their hands throughout the day.

Staff will also continue to remind students to be respectful of others' personal space while going through daily school activities.

Finally, The decision to wear a mask beyond when it is required by public health is a personal one, and based on individual preference. Some students and staff may choose to continue to wear a nonmedical mask or face covering throughout the day or for certain activities. Individual decisions around mask wearing will be supported and respected at Franklin Elementary. We are all looking forward to working with the children in September and we are committed to making your year a happy and successful experience.

MOBILE PHONES AND ELECTRONIC DEVICES

It is now common for students to carry cell phones and other electronic devices to school. We recognize that for some families a phone is important for communication between parents/caregivers before and after school. Cell phones can be a source of disruption in the classroom, especially when used for texting, a safety concern on the playground, and a cause for social difficulties, especially amongst older children. This means cell phones can only be used during the school day under the direct instruction and supervision of school staff (teachers/support staff etc.) While students can carry cell phones to school, we ask that parents support our efforts for appropriate use by adhering to the following guidelines:

- Unless teachers have specified the use of personal digital devices for use in the classroom (e.g. for research purposes), students may not use cell phones in classrooms, hallways or on the playground during the school day.
- Cell phones at school must be turned off and kept in a zipped backpack, or a safe place permitted by staff, between 8:55 a.m. and 3:03 p.m.



- Cell phones are often equipped with cameras. Students may not take pictures at school. In order to satisfy legal requirements around the protection of privacy, photography at school is allowed only for school purposes and with the permission of a staff member. Permitted photos can only be used with parental consent.
- Please understand that the school takes no responsibility for loss or damage to any personal electronic devices.

Pupil Use of Telephone

Students do no have general access to the school phones, however, your child is welcome to use the office phone if they have an urgent need to contact you during the school day and parents are welcome to phone the school office if they have a message for their child. Children require approval from a staff member prior to the use of a telephone. Generally, approval will not be given to arrange visits with friends.

PARENT-TEACHER CONFERENCES

The Goal-Setting conferences will be held on <u>October 5 and 6</u>. The conferences will provide parents an opportunity to connect with your child's teacher and learn about your child's programming. Your teacher wil send you more information regarding signing up for a conference time. **Please be reminded that students will be dismissed at 2:00 pm on both days.**

STAFF PARKING LOT

Please be reminded that the staff parking lot is for staff ONLY.



PARKING/DROP OFF PROCEDURES

Please respect the traffic and parking signs around our school. Please be reminded that the driving limit in the school zone is **30km/h** from 8 am to 5 pm on school days.

For the safety of the children, please drive carefully and obey traffic signs around school grounds The following are traffic signs that are typically posted around Vancouver schools.



"NO STOPPING 8am - 5pm SCHOOL DAYS"

These signs designate the zones where vehicles are not permitted to stop under circumstances. These zones are kept clear to provide good sight lines for drivers see students and students to see drivers.



"NO PARKING 8am - 5pm SCHOOL DAYS"

These signs designate the zones for active picking up and dropping off of stude Do not park and leave the vehicle in these zones.



School Area Signs

This sign is used in advance of school to warn drivers that children may be wallalong or crossing the road. On local streets 30 km/hr signs are posted and speed limit is 30 km/hr from 8am - 5pm on school days.



School Crosswalk Signs

A school crosswalk sign indicates where children will be crossing the road. Vehic must yield to pedestrians at all intersections and crosswalks. Vehicles must rem stopped until children are safely across and on the curb. Please remember child are playful and impulsive and may enter the roadway suddenly.
