GRENFELL OUTDOOR CLASSROOM

We are excited to share that the District has received a grant from the BC Parks Foundation to design and construct a nature park/outdoor learning space on the Grenfell School site. The project is currently at the design stage. As part of the ongoing design process, and in keeping with our commitment to incorporate student voices, we have planned an

engagement session with some students from Grenfell. We will gather student feedback based on their lived experiences as students at Grenfell and as future users of the new outdoor space. Our teaching staff will also have an opportunity to share their thoughts and suggestions regarding features that they would like to see incorporated in the Outdoor Classroom. PERSONAL DIGITAL DEVICES

As you may know, in January 2024, the Provincial of BC mandated all school boards to update their Codes of Conduct to limit students' use of personal digital devices during school hours. Personal digital devices are now restricted throughout the instructional day (9:00am to 2:58 pm). Devices must be turned off or set to silent mode and kept out of sight for the entire school day. At Grenfell, students must keep their digital devices in their backpacks when <u>riding the bus</u> and <u>at school</u>. Please be aware that your child does not need a digital device at school for educational purposes as we have student laptops and ipads for students. And finally, we request that parents and caregivers please refrain from contacting your child on their phone during school hours (9:00 am to 2:58 pm).

TERRY FOX RUN





FOUNDATION SKILLS ASSESSMENT (FSA)

Students in Grade 4 and 7 will write the Foundation Skills Assessment (FSA) during the month of October. FSA is the only scandalized test administered to Grade 4 and 7 students in BC. The result of the FSA provides information to parents/guardians and school staff about how students are progressing in key academic skills. Together with other information about a student's learning, it helps teachers and educators respond to students' learning needs for the rest of the school year. The FSA also helps us as an education system to better understand how we can help improve student progress in literacy and numeracy – one of the goals in our new Education Plan.
