# TUPPER TECH TRADES SAMPLER



## **Program Outline**

This special program allows students to explore several Red Seal construction and mechanical trades. The program includes English 12, CLC, and 16 elective credits. Additionally, students are given Work Experience opportunities intended to convert to full-time apprenticeship or as preparation for a Foundation program in a specific trade.

This program is a good fit for students with a desire for hands-on learning.

## **Application Process - apply in Grade 11**

Start by visiting careerprograms.vsb.bc.ca to download an application. Students are encouraged to discuss the application with a school counsellor and family.

Application Deadline March 1st Interview Period March - April

Acceptance Decisions May Orientation Session June

Specific details about the Orientation Session will be included in the acceptance letter. Students must attend along with a parent or guardian.

# **Program Location & Intake Dates**

The program takes place at Tupper Secondary School, starting in September.

Students should anticipate transitioning to apprenticeship in Semester 2 rather than returning to their home school.

This program is available to students who hold Canadian citizenship or Permanent Resident status and who attend a Vancouver School Board school or alternative program.

Any Grade 11 Woodwork, Metalwork, or Automotive course Youth EXPLORE Trades (where offered)

#### **Funding Commitment**

There are no tuition costs for this program. Any Foundation training tuition is not funded by the VSB. Students are expected to pay for equipment, tools, some certifications, and PPE - approximately \$500.

Tupper Tech - 8 credits Apprenticeship - up to 16 credits
