Run Club

Unfortunately, we cannot have you run with us for safety reasons – but you are welcome to run on a Tuesday and record your own time). Each participant will tally their distance for that Tuesday. We will keep a record and see how many Kilometers each participant goes from November to June.

When an adult or student reaches:

- 10 km -they will get a special SOAR 10 km participant ribbon
- 21 km they will get a special SOAR Half-Marathon Medal
- 42 km they will get a special SOAR Marathon Medal and some extra SOAR swag!

New Rainy-Day Policy

As you may be aware, ¿uuqinak' uuh (Grandview) has had to implement a New Rainy-Day Policy. As per Dr. Henry's instructions for a safe return to school, all schools across BC have been directed to hold all recess and lunch breaks outside. Students can still eat in the building but must do so in their classrooms to avoid large congregations in the lunchroom. Dr. Henry says that this change will hopefully not be forever, and we can revisit this policy in the future. In the meantime, please remember:

Please send students dressed for the weather. Consider sending jackets, boots, hats, and mitts. Umbrellas are also acceptable to send.

We understand this is a significant change for our kids, and we want to make sure our students are as warm and comfortable as possible. To help with this, we have split the lunchtime for Gr. K-3 and Gr 4-7. The split lunch gives each class access to a large undercover area during their respective breaks. The students do not have to stay in the Under-Cover Area, but we encourage them to stay there if they do not dress for the weather. We have also purchased extra jackets, rain boots and warm weather gear, and extra clothes if our students forget appropriate weather clothing at home or need to change into dry clothes when they come in. MESSAGE FROM OUR NEIGHBOURHOOD ASSISTANT

Hello Parents and Guardians:

I hope everyone had a fun and safe Halloween. I would like to share some programs we have going on. On Tuesday mornings, I have some food items to give away (pasta noodle, tomato sauce, soup, canned tuna and turkey, bread, milk, and breakfast bars). I am at the staffroom window from 9 am till 9:15 am. On Friday after school (unless it is a Proday or holiday then it is on Thursday), I have Backpack Buddies' bags to give away. For those families that are new to Grandview, Backpack Buddies is an organization that donates food bags to our school. Each bag contains snacks and food for the weekend. Again the pickup time is Friday after school (3pm– first come, first served, till they are gone) at the staffroom window.

Kindergarten registration for children born in 2016 begins on November 1.

All kindergarten applicants are required to submit an application to their English catchment elementary school. This includes families who wish to apply for choice programs (Early French Immersion, Montessori, Indigenous Focus School, Early Mandarin Bilingual, Nootka Fine Arts) and/or a cross boundary placement.

The priority registration period for Kindergarten opens on **November 1 and closes at 4 pm on January 29**. Students who submit an application within this priority period will be accommodated <u>before</u> late applicants.

Applying for kindergarten is a 2-step process:

Step 1: Completion of an online application form

Step 2: Verifying documentation

- Contact your English catchment school office to set up an appointment to bring your supporting documentation
- Bring supporting documentation to your English catchment school office during your scheduled appointment

Supporting documents needed:

- Proof of residence in Vancouver
- Child's birth certificate
- Immigration documentation (if applicable)
- Immunization records
- Court orders/documents (if applicable)

If you want to apply for a District program or cross-boundary, you must <u>first apply to your English catchment elementary</u> <u>school</u>. Applications for District programs and cross boundary placements will begin to be accepted in early 2021.

In the event there are more in-catchment applicants than available space* at the school, the following process will be used to prioritize enrolment:

Kindergarten Applications Received Between November 1 and January 31

- 1. **In-catchment** kindergarten applicants with siblings in attendance at the school (and who will be attending next year) will be placed first.
- 2. The names of all other in-catchment registrants will be entered into a **random draw** for the remaining kindergarten spaces.
- 3. Students who cannot be accommodated will be placed on a waitlist in the order in which their name was drawn.
- 4. Between January 31 and the second Friday in June, students on the ordered waitlist will be accommodated as space be comes available.

Kindergarten Registrations Received AFTER January 31st

In-catchment kindergarten students who apply **after** January 31 will be accommodated if there is space. If there is no space their names will be added to the bottom of the existing waitlist.

Note: There will be no priority given to registrants with siblings if they register after January 31.
