Technology and Toys in School



Please be advised, we ask that students do NOT bring personal electronics (i-phones, i-watches, i-pads, android devices, etc.) or other toys to school. If a teacher asks students to bring any items in for Sharing/

Show and Tell, they will communicate that with parents. Otherwise, we ask for no toys at school. Sometimes these items get lost or broken which results in disappointment or tears, particularly if the item cannot be repaired or found.

With respect to use of technology, students are easily distracted by their devices, particularly in the intermediate grades. If your child does not have a phone we would encourage you to try and hold off from getting them one. There is a growing campaign to align parents in this mission called "Wait 'till Grade 8." For more information on this campaign and the research behind it, Google: Wait Till 8. There is appropriate technology in classrooms and there will be no reason why your child needs a phone at school. If your child is bringing a phone to school, it must remain in their bags at all times, keeping in mind we cannot be responsible for lost devices. It is not allowed out before school, after school, at recess, lunch or during school time. If a cellphone is seen by a staff member, we will be asking the child to hand the phone in for the day and we will require parent consent for it to be returned. If cell phones become a disruption to the learning environment, students may be asked to hand them in at the beginning of the day, they will be put in a secure location, and returned at the end of the day. We also ask that, if students need to

call home during the day they do so from the phone in the office. Thank you.







