# Kindergarten Registration 2023-2024

With the opening of school kindergarten registration for the 2023-2024 school year on November 1, the registration process will have two steps:

- <u>Step 1</u>: Complete the online registration at <u>vsbapplynow.vsb.bc.ca</u>—print out the completed registration form
- Step 2: Phone the school to make an appointment to bring in your documents (604-713-5290). At the time of your appointment, bring the completed registration form along with the required documents to your catchment school. Thank you.

#### Supporting documents needed:

Proof of residence in Vancouver
Child's birth certificate
Immigration documentation (if applicable)
Immunization records

Court orders/documents (if applicable)



**NOTE:** The registration process is not complete until you have completed both steps in the process. Priority registration for in-catchment students ends on January 31st. If we have more applications for kindergarten than we have available spaces, a draw will be held.

If you know families with children who were born in 2018, please remind them to register for Kindergarten.

If you have not already done so, login and confirm that you and your child have read and understand these guidelines <a href="HERE">HERE</a>. You will need your child's 9-digit Personal Education Number (PEN) and their date of birth to login.

The regular transition process for Grade 7 students going into Grade 8 starts in January. Students need to complete both the District Registry process (<a href="available from November 7 - December 15">available from November 7 - December 15</a>, <a href="2022">2022</a>), and then apply directly to the Mini School programs through Mini School program websites. It is not an expectation that children apply to mini school and, as mentioned above, regular grade 8 registration starts in January.

Thank you to all the families who were able to donate for the Terry Fox Run. This year, our total raised was \$1570! Well done Nightingale!





our lives. As part of this journey, we are creating a whole school art collaboration called "the tending and mending project" that will be located in the main atrium of the school. Here, students, caregivers and staff can stitch a piece of printed fabric onto a long and ever growing bandage as a way of sitting with and tending to feelings of hurt; whether from a bump on the playground, an argument with a friend, the feeling of missing someone or something important, the feeling of being overwhelmed by things beyond our control or simply from having a bad day. It can also be a quiet place to slow down and show care for the hurt of others by

stitching a word or an image onto one of the fabric pieces already attached. It is the hope that as this bandage grows, it will become a beautiful symbol of the strength and depth of care and connectedness in

our school community. Once we get started, I would also love to have volunteers to help with keeping a steady supply of threaded and knotted needles to be kept in the office for students and others in our school community to use throughout the day for stitching. Please let Angela Hughes or Colleen Mieczaniec know if you would like to be involved. I hope to join you at the next PAC meeting to share more about the projects for the year.
