This month, recognition of Remembrance Day at Nightingale was on November 10 and I would like to thank the students who participated. The songs, poems and messages of peace give us all hope for a peaceful future. The school will be writing a cheque to The Poppy Fund the donations we received and we thank those families who were able to contribute this year.

Today, staff participated in an in-service day focused on Indigenous education through a district-wide virtual conference. Staff also took some time throughout the day reflecting on and reviewing the presentations. This important work is ongoing throughout the district following our anti-racism in-service last school year and our Indigenous focus days in the previous three school years.

With this acknowledgement comes the commitment to engage in ongoing acts of reconciliation.

PAC Updates

At Florence Nightingale Elementary, we are fortunate to have an engaged parent community and wonderful educators that are dedicated to helping our children become well-rounded learners. We witness the excitement as they come home and sing a new song, share a moral lesson learned, or present a masterpiece perfect for framing and hanging on the wall.

<u>The music program</u>—Purchasing instruments to support music at Nightingale so that Mr. Bonnell can continue to inspire our children to spread joy through music.

<u>Literacy</u>—Enhancing the classroom libraries so that teachers can tailor the class's reading and interest level while also providing the opportunity for self-selection.



Family Affordability Fund

As you are aware, the Family Affordability Fund was recently distributed to school districts. Over the past couple of weeks, I asked for feedback from staff and families with respect to allocating these funds and we are now ready to implement the general plan as follows:

- Targeted funds to help individual families with food security (gift cards for grocery stores)
- Targeted funds to help individual families with other items such as children's clothing (jackets, boots, etc.) or to subsidize fees in the school year (such as grad hoodies, field trips)
- Universal funds to help all families (e.g., subsidize class field trips for every family so the trip is less expensive for all, subsidize a performance cost so it is less expensive to all families, grad hoodies/events etc.)

The school was allocated \$25,000. This is one-time funding and must be spent by the end of June. The first two items are to support those families in financial hardship. If your family is in need of financial assistance and would benefit from one or both of the above two items, please reach out to me at aahughes@vsb.bc.ca, and we will assist where we can. Item number 3 will be determined throughout the year and will benefit all families.

Thank you to all the families who were able to donate for the Terry Fox Run. This year, our total raised was \$1570! Well done Nightingale!





our lives. As part of this journey, we are creating a whole school art collaboration called "the tending and mending project" that will be located in the main atrium of the school. Here, students, caregivers and staff can stitch a piece of printed fabric onto a long and ever growing bandage as a way of sitting with and tending to feelings of hurt; whether from a bump on the playground, an argument with a friend, the feeling of missing someone or something important, the feeling of being overwhelmed by things beyond our control or simply from having a bad day. It can also be a quiet place to slow down and show care for the hurt

of others by stitching a word or an image onto one of the fabric pieces already attached. It is the hope that as this bandage grows, it will become a beautiful symbol of the strength and depth of care and connectedness in our school community. Once we get started, I would also love to have volunteers to help with keeping a steady supply of threaded and knotted needles to be kept in the office for students and others in our school community to use throughout the day for stitching. 




