Notice of Late Return and Are You Moving?

As we are planning for September, here are a few reminders for over the summer:

- If you move over the summer and will be in a new school catchment, please wait until both schools reopen at the end of August to put in a transfer request. You can pick up a transfer form at Nightingale and we will send that to your new catchment school. If you already know you are moving but have yet to inform the school, please contact the office as soon as possible to let us know. Thank you.
- If you are not moving but intend on returning to Nightingale after Friday, September 6 but before Monday, September 30, please complete the Notice of Late Return Form and send it to the office before noon on Friday, September 30. If your child is unaccounted for by noon on Friday, September 6 we may remove them from our organization and then give that space to a child on the waitlist if we have one.
