Book: Beautiful You, Beautiful Me

TALK

"Beautiful You, Beautiful Me" explores the feelings of a mixed heritage child who notices differences between herself and her mother; and who finds beauty, self-love, acceptance and belonging in their differences.

Talk: Read this book together as a family, and have a conversation about the differences and similarities of people who are in your child's life, e.g. family, classmates, teammates, neighbor's, etc.

Conversation Ideas:

- Look at class/team photos and have conversations about their peers in the photos:
 - Ask about the number of friends in the class. (Great for counting.)
 - Talk about their differences, e.g. hair color and length, eye color, skin color, height, culture/ethnicity, ways of dressing, etc. (Create a statistic board and do comparisons.
 Count how many friends have long hair, short hair, brown eyes, blue eyes, etc.)
 - o Talk about differences in preferences, e.g., I like apples, you don't.
 - Use positive, inclusive and appropriate language when discussing differences.
 - Talk about similarities, e.g., their interests, favorite toys, food, sport, etc. (Even though people have physical differences, we are very much alike.)
- Suggest readings of "Shades of People" and "We are All Alike...We are All Different" to aid in discussions.





CREATE

Family Photo:

Draw a picture of your family. From the crayons provided in the WTK bag, match the closest color to the skin tone of your family members and color the picture.





Extension: use drawings to make family finger puppets or stick puppets.

Be inspired: Create your own family or friends version of "We are All Alike....We are All different". Draw pictures or write down similarities and differences between family members or friends.

PLAY

Skin color match-ups:

- Material: white paper or cardstock + skintone crayons
- Instructions:
 - Cut 16 pieces of equal size cards.
 - Create 8 pairs of matching cards using skintone crayons
 - Option: draw faces on the cards.
- To play: turn cards over and find matching pairs.
- Variation: Create matching cards with different skin colors and various facial expressions.
 - o To play: find matches of the same color and facial expressions.
