acknowledge the different cultures and backgrounds of our students and families. Students are influenced and moulded by the culture and area in which they live. Students identify with the values, norms, and traditions that are part of their family. Culture exists in all families

and helps to define how we interact with one another. **Think/Communicate** Research an influential person from a different culture; focus on how that person's culture influenced their actions: food, family, music, location, traditions, etc. Create a brief presentation about how the person's culture influenced their contribution to society and share with classmates, family, and friends.



We recognize our interdependence with other people and with the world in which we live. They learn and experience the importance of being physically, mentally and personally well balanced.








Making the MYP Connection at School
