Mask Wearing in Schools

The VSB Board adopted a motion extending the current MOE/PHO mask mandate to include all students (K-12). They will be amending our District plan to reflect this change and will be sending elementary schools updated mask posters next week. This new K-12 mask mandate came into effect on Monday October 4.

The extension of the 4-12 mask mandate to K-3 students includes the same exceptions to mask wearing, as outlined in the MOE guidelines and the District COVID-19 plan. These exceptions are:

- A person who cannot tolerate wearing a mask for health or behavioural reasons;
- A person who is unable to put on or remove a mask without the assistance of another person;
- If the mask is removed temporarily for the purposes of identifying the person wearing it;
- If the mask is removed temporarily to engage in an educational activity that cannot be performed while wearing a mask (e.g., playing a wind instrument, engaging in high-intensity physical activity, etc.);
- If a person is eating or drinking;
- If a person is behind a barrier/plexiglass; or
- While providing a service to a person with a disability or diverse ability (including but not limited to a hearing impairment) where visual cues, facial expressions and/or lip reading/movements are important.

The school has a finite number of masks available to replace masks that are lost, broken or wet.

Please makes sure you send your child with enough masks to last the day.

Safety Awarenes s Corner

This month we explore the student's role in managing anaphylaxis

- Avoid sharing food.
- Only eat approved food from home or food that a parent or guardian has approved.
- Don't share utensils or straws.
- Always read food labels yourself and don't eat anything with precautionary warnings, like "may contain". These are not safe to eat.
- Tell others about your allergy. Let them know where you keep your autoinjector.
- Always carry at least one epinephrine auto-injector with you. You never know when you may need it.
- Wear MedicAlert® identification (get one at NoChildWithout.ca).
- Wash your hands before and after eating.
- If you are allergic to stinging insects, avoid wearing bright colours and scented products.
- Tell an adult when you don't feel well.
- If you are being bullied or excluded because of your allergy, speak to an adult.
- If you're a preteen or teen, visit <u>WhyRisklt.ca</u> to see how your peers manage their allergies.

Do you have a child that will be ready for Kindergarten?

At the beginning of December all Secord Families will be receiving a letter asking if they have children ready for Kindergarten in September 2021. If this applies to you, please respond to the letter via email.

Priority registration is given to children that already have siblings in the school if the families register before the end of January.

you are registering a child for kindergarten and currently have a child in Early French Immersion at Secord (who will be at Secord next year as well), your child is eligible for sibling placement priority. However, you still must register the child at your incatchment English school first (even though your child would not attend there). You will then need to apply online in mid-January indicating French Immersion at Secord as your first choice. Failure to follow these procedures and deadlines will result in your child losing sibling priority.

The child is accepted automatically into the Program that the older siblings are in.

Are you a Newcomer Parent?

Are you new to VSB, Vancouver, or even Canada? Vancouver School Board has a department you may be interested in: The Newcomer Welcome Centre. You may not be aware of how many resources are available to you. For example our SWIS team (Settlement Workers in Schools) and Multicultural Liaison Workers are presenting free workshops! Take a look and even wander the website. We think you'll be pleasantly surprised





All kindergarten applicants are required to submit an application to their English catchment elementary school. This includes families who wish to apply for District programs (Early French Immersion, Montessori, Indigenous Focus School, Early Mandarin Bilingual, Nootka Fine Arts) and/or a cross boundary placement.

The priority registration period for kindergarten opens on **November 1 and closes at 4 pm on January 31**. Students who submit an application within this priority period will be accommodated <u>before</u> late applicants.

1. Registration Process:

- The process is similar to last year.
 - o Applying for kindergarten is a 2-step process:
 - Step 1: Completion of an online application form.
 - Step 2: Verifying Documentation
 - Contact your English catchment school office to set up an appointment to bring your supporting documentation
 - Bring supporting documentation to your English catchment school office during your scheduled appointment

Supporting Documents Needed:

- 1. Proof of residence in Vancouver
- 2. Child's birth certificate
- 3. Immigration documentation (if applicable)
- 4. Immunization records
- 5. Court orders/documents (if applicable)

If you want to apply for a District program or cross-boundary, you must <u>first apply to your English catchment elementary school</u>. Applications for District programs and cross boundary placements will begin to be accepted in early 2022.

Registering at the Annex or the Main School

(____School and ____Annex) share one common catchment area. Students who reside within this catchment area (in-catchment registrants) will receive priority for enrolment at one of the two school sites based upon available space.*

When completing a registration form, parents will be asked if they prefer the annex or the main school. The District will attempt to accommodate parental preferences for placement, once available space has been determined.

At some sites there may be more in-catchment applicants than available space.* In these instances, the following process will be used to prioritize enrolment:

<u>Kindergarten Applications Received Between November 1 and January</u> 31

- 1. In-catchment kindergarten registrants who have a sibling who is currently attending and who will continue to attend Secord & Q. Vic next year will be enrolled first at their preferred location.
- 2. The names of all other in-catchment registrants will be entered into a **random draw** for the remaining kindergarten spaces. Students will be registered at their preferred location as space permits.
- 3. Students who cannot be accommodated at their preferred location will be accommodated at the location that has space and placed on waitlist for their preferred location in the order in which their name is drawn.
- 4. Kindergarten Registrations Received AFTER January 31
- 5. All in-catchment kindergarten applications received **after** January 31 will be registered at their preferred location, if there is space, or added to the bottom of the existing waitlist for their preferred location, and registered at the location that has space to accommodate them.
- 6. **Please note**: There will be no priority given to registrants with siblings already attending Secord & Q. Vic if they register after January 31.
- 7. * Available space includes physical capacity, resources, staffing, or educational programs available or planned for a school as defined by the District (Administrative Procedures 300).




