Wear your Orange Shirt to School

on September 30th

When thinking about Orange Shirt Day and Residential Schools, what resonates is the loss of innocence. Children reach school age and ideally start school with innocence. How could orange r represent Phyllis Webstad's innocence, the day her orange shirt was taken away? The salmon egg represents the beginning of a journey, a birth, a hope. Like salmon, children grow into their world, their home, and they remember where home is. Residential schools were designed to make Indigenous children forget home, forget who they were, and forget where they came from. In that moment when the belongings are taken away, when the orange shirt was taken away from Phyllis Webstad, was when part of that innocence was taken away. It represents the culture that

residential schools were designed to extinguish.

Culturally, salmon represents precious food resources for many British Columbia nations that reside up and down the coast and the inland rivers. It is something they identify with, it is home, and to most, it is medicine. Salmon are birth and hope. They grow and go out into the world and go back home. They always remember where home is. When looking at salmon, it is a way of seeing the world and part of understanding it.

The eyes are very important. They are about seeing. For thousands of years Indigenous peoples have had to understand the relationships between each other and their surroundings, their place in it and within their communities. Seeing is recognizing the past, present and future the ancestors, the current families, the future families who are not here yet.

It is important that we recognize those who have endured residential school, and those who come from families that went. Remembering helps our future. Remembering and teaching about it will help to make change. The salmon egg represents those students who went, who never forgot where their home was, and those who may not have made it back.

September 25th is a professional development day for staff. The school will be closed for students.

STUDENTS WITH SERIOUS HEALTH CONDITIONS & ALLERGIES

The VSB requires that parents notify the school every year about their child's severe allergy or medical condition.

Parents are asked to provide the school with a complete emergency care plan with the correct dosage of any medication your child requires from their doctor. In order for the school to provide your child with medication, the "*Request for administration of Medication at School*" form must be completed by parents and the doctor who has prescribed the medication.

Parents must provide the child (in their backpack) or school office with at least one **epinephrine auto**injector (EpiPen in the case of <u>severe allergies</u> or **Inhalers** for children who suffer with <u>asthmatic</u> <u>conditions</u>.

It is also essential that parents make note of the <u>expiry dates</u> of all medication kept at school to ensure it is replaced as necessary. The school is not responsible for monitoring expiry dates.

CHAMPLAIN HEIGHTS ANNEX - VSB SAFE ARRIVAL PROGRAM

We wish to thank the parents and guardians who are following the district-wide Safe Arrival Program.

- It is important that all parents and guardians report a child's absence or late arrival to the school prior to 9:00 am daily whenever possible **please use the phone or email system below.**
- Students who arrive late (after the 9:00 bell) must proceed to the outside door of the classroom and have the teacher let them in.
- If the school is not informed of a student's absence or late arrival, they are considered 'UNACCOUNTED FOR" and office staff will then call: <u>home, cell and/or work numbers</u> of parents for verification.
- This procedure has been put in place for all Vancouver schools to ensure all students arrive safely at school.
