THEREFORE BE IT RESOLVED that the Union of BC Municipalities petition the provincial government to increase funding levels for primary and secondary education in the province."

WHEREAS School districts have faced cumulative years of underfunding from the provincial government;

AND WHEREAS the Vancouver school district has an accumulated \$40 million annual operating shortfall due to unfunded cost increases since 2001:

AND WHEREAS the Vancouver school district not only provides education to students, it employs thousands of Vancouver residents and purchases significant amounts of goods and services in our city;

AND WHEREAS reductions to staffing and services to students creates hardships for families and greater long-term costs to communities;

AND WHEREAS the social and economic health of cities is directly affected by the ability of its public schools to meet the needs of all learners.

THEREFORE BE IT RESOLVED THAT the Vancouver Board of Education request that Vancouver City Councilors speak to and support a motion from the Saanich Municipality at the 2009 September meeting of the Union of BC Municipalities in Vancouver advising the provincial government that public education underfunding affects the social and economic health of the community.

The VBE cordially requests Vancouver City Council support. We look forward to your response to this request.
