HAMMERING IT OUT!

The ACE IT Automotive Collision Repair Technician program helps you follow your passion and make it your career. The skills and experience acquired, combined with your mechanical aptitude, will give you a boost into the work of an Automotive Collision Repair Technician.

Upon successful completion, you will receive credit for Level 1 Technical Training of the Automotive Collision Repair apprenticeship program.

Automotive Collision Repair Technician is a nationally designated trade under the Interprovincial Red Seal program

This nine month program is 4 days a week (Monday to Thursday) from 8:00 am to 3:00 pm at VCC from October to June.

THE TASK AT HAND

- learn safe work practices
- restore damaged metal frames and body sections
- remove and replace damaged sections of body panels
- assess vehicle damages and determine how to fix it
- learn to file, grind, sand and paint the repaired body surface

WHAT YOU NEED

You must intend to complete all secondary school graduation requirements and have:

- as many automotive courses as possible
- an "L" driver's license
- work experience
- attended the VCC Transportation Trades Tour

Steps to become certified as a RED SEAL AUTOMOTIVE COLLISION REPAIR TECHNICIAN

- 5 months school (ACE IT) Level 1 Technical Training
 - 5 weeks Levels 2
 - 6 weeks Level 3
 - 6720 total work based
 training hours

- good general health and respiratory condition
- physical strength and stamina
- ability to tolerate noise and vibration

- good line, form and depth perception

- 28 credits towards graduation.
- an additional 16 credits if enrolled in Secondary School Apprenticeship either during or at the completion of the ACE IT program

After you have achieved this you are be able to start your apprenticeship with a trades qualified Automotive Collision Repair Technician.

HOW TO MAKE IT HAPPEN!

The next steps are for you to:

- Meet with your counsellor and parent(s) to help plan the program
- Complete and application package and submit it to any of the above

After that, the VSB District Career Programs staff will review the application then arrange an interview.
