PROJECT HIGHLIGHTS

Elsie Roy Elementary was built in 2004 to serve the new False Creek and Yaletown communities. The development of this site was done in partnership with the City of Vancouver.

The school adjoins Dorothy Lam Childcare Centre overlooking False Creek and David Lam Park. The school design references the industrial history of the Roundhouse Neighbourhood by incorporating elements such as the heavy timber at the school's main entrance.

The school is a two storey structure and parking is located underground to maximize outdoor space. The library is designed to maximize views overlooking False Creek. The school also shares elevator access with the childcare facility and shares the playfield at David Lam Park.

A four classroom addition is currently being constructed to accommodate full day kindergarten programming and enrolment growth.
